The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>18th August</u> 2016 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### 2016-2017 BUDGET OVERVIEW

The 2016-2017 Budget was adopted by Council at a Special Meeting held on 14 July. The 2016-2017 Budget includes an increase in both Rural UV rates and townsite GRV rates of 5%, with minimum rates increasing to \$435.00 per assessment. Highlights of the budget include:

#### **ROADS**

Expenditure of \$2,423,100 has been allocated to various road construction projects for the year. Council will be assisted in meeting the costs of the projects with funds from the Regional Road Group, Commodity Routes and Roads to Recovery programs.

Council has been fortunate to receive a large amount of funding from the Regional Road Group for construction projects in 2016/17, and additional funding from the Roads to Recovery pool results in a significantly larger program scheduled for the coming year.

The following projects are planned for 2016/17 -

#### **REGIONAL ROAD GROUP**

#### (funded 2/3 State and 1/3 Roads to Recovery)

- Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road reseal 2.19kms;
- Pallinup South Road construct and seal 3.00kms;
- Warrenup Road construct and seal 2.15kms.

#### (funded 2/3 State and 1/3 Council)

- Punchmirup South Road stabilise patches and seal 6.32kms;
- Broomehill-Kojonup Road stabilise patches and surface correction 1.90kms;

#### **ROADS TO RECOVERY (fully Federal funded)**

- Carry over widening & resheeting on Punchmirup North Road 4.00kms
- Tieline North Road widen and resheet 5.02kms;
- Flat Rocks Road reseal 7.10kms.

#### COMMODITY ROUTES (funded 2/3 State and 1/3 Shire)

- Carry over gravel sheeting on Beejenup Road 4.00kms
- Beejenup Road vegetation widening and gravel sheet 6.82kms;
- Nardlah Road construct and seal 5.40kms.

#### **ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS – COUNTRY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND**

Council received its 2012/13 allocation from the Country Local Government Fund of \$374,889 during 2014/2015. Projects completed during 2014/2015 utilising these funds included the installation of a photovoltaic system at the Broomehill Administration office, and renovations to the understage area at the Broomehill Hall.

The balance of these funds has been carried forward to complete the following works in 2016/17 -

• Tambellup Hall - Building Improvements

\$50,000 has been allocated to upgrade the ablutions and replace section of the roof.

• Tambellup Pavilion - Redevelopment

\$194,889 will be utilised towards redevelopment of the Tambellup Pavilion. These funds will be used in conjunction with other grant funding, a loan and transfer from Councils Reserve.

#### Country Local Government Fund – Regional component

50% of Councils allocation from 2012/13 Country Local Government Fund is administered via a regional pool. Broomehill-Tambellup has identified its regional grouping as the Southern Link VROC which includes the Shires of Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet. The funding is pooled for the group as a whole, and Council acts as the banker for the VROC. The intention of the regional groupings component is to provide financial assistance to local governments to fund larger scale infrastructure projects which demonstrate wider community benefits across a region.

The funds held in the regional pool are being used to fund construction of 'Independent Living Seniors Accommodation' in the Cranbrook and Kojonup Shires.

#### OTHER PROJECTS

#### **Integrated Planning**

The 2016/17 Budget has provided for continuing development of Councils Asset Management Plans and Long Term Financial Plan. The four year review of the Strategic Community Plan is due in 2016, and funds have been set aside to ensure compliance in this area is met. This will prompt a review of Councils Corporate Business Plan. The Long Term Financial Plan will be reviewed annually to ensure alignment with current budgets.

#### **Executive Residence**

In 2015 Council purchased land at Lot 63 Taylor Street Tambellup, where a new executive residence will be constructed. Council awarded tender for the construction of the new residence to Wauters Enterprises, who commenced construction in April 2016. Completion of construction of the new residence has been carried over into this budget, and is fully funded by the Building Reserve.

#### **Tambellup Pavilion Redevelopment**

Council awarded the tender for construction of the new Pavilion to Wauters Enterprises, and the tender for installation of the synthetic bowling green was awarded to Evergreen Synthetic Grass. Howard + Heaver Architects have been engaged as project managers for the construction. The project commenced with demolition of the pavilion and old changerooms towards the end of June.

To assist with the costs for construction of the new facility, funding from the following sources has been confirmed –

Department of Sport & Recreation CSRFF	\$700,000
National Stronger Regions Fund	\$950,000
Great Southern Development Commission	\$200,000
Country Local Government Fund 2012/13	\$194,889

Council also holds funds in the Tambellup Recreation Ground and Pavilion Reserve, which will be utilised for this project. The budget includes provision to raise a loan for \$1.15 million to ensure completion of the project. Applications for further funding will be submitted to assist with fit-out of the new building which, if successful, will aid in reducing the amount required in loan funds.

The Tambellup Sports Pavilion Advisory Committee was formed by the Council with members of community groups and sporting bodies to see the redevelopment to fruition and to undertake the planning for a new management committee structure to manage the facility once complete.

#### **Building Maintenance**

Council is responsible for the provision of buildings and other facilities, which includes public halls, sporting pavilions, administration centres and other community facilities. To ensure that Councils buildings continue to meet the required level of service, following is some of the more significant items of maintenance that are planned to be undertaken during the year —

Broomehill Administration Building – replace 3 air conditioners in Archive Repository, rectify roof & ceiling issues; Tambellup Infant Health Clinic – replace kitchen sink & cupboards;

Broomehill Museum – repair/paint woodwork on external windows, repair office ceiling & walls, replace roof; Tambellup Museum – exterior painting, oil verandah flooring;

Tambellup Railway Station – replace gutters & fascia, rectify sagging roof;

#### **CONCLUSION**

The 2016/17 budget provides for the operations of the Council for the coming financial year. The total budget for the year is \$15.4million of which \$9.5m (62%) will be spent on replacement, renewal or upgrade of Councils assets.

Funds have been allocated across the following areas –

Transport (which includes road construction/maintenance and plant replacement) accounts for around 45% of the overall budget. The other area of significant expenditure is Recreation and Culture (which includes redevelopment of the Tambellup Pavilion) accounting for 30% of total expenditure.

The planned capital works improvements represent a significant investment in infrastructure by the Shire over the next 12 months. Various funding programs for road construction and community projects have contributed considerably to this year's budget, which is the largest in value adopted by the Council since the amalgamation. The challenge now lies ahead to ensure that the services and projects are delivered in a cost effective, timely manner.

#### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- Council approved an application lodged by CBH for open bulk heads and grain storage to remain on Lot 4 Nardlah Road, Broomehill subject to conditions.
- Council discussed a range of matters that will be presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Western Australian Local Government Association which will be held during Local Government Week in August.
- Council considered the progress report for the Strategic Community Plan to the end of June 2016. The majority of the strategies developed to progress the Plan have been achieved, or are ongoing. A small number have not been commenced, and these will be addressed during the full review of the Plan which will be completed, with community consultation, during 2016-2017. The full report will be included in Council's Annual Report for 2015-2016, to be published later in the year.
- Council granted a rate concession for the Tambellup Golf Club for the 2016/2017 financial year.
- Council considered a request from the Department of Agriculture and Food WA for a financial contribution towards a 'Mapping Food Production' project. Council determined not to make a contribution at this time.
- Council considered and prioritised Regional Road Group projects for 2017-2018. Further information will be available once funding has been confirmed.
- Council considered and approved a request from the Vietnam Veterans Association of Australia -WA Branch for assistance with a commemorative service to be held at the Tambellup Cemetery on 12<sup>th</sup> August to commemorate the Vietnam War and the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan.

#### **WORKS**

The rain, while welcome, continued to impact on the works program through July. Weeding and mowing have been the main activities for the parks and gardens crew, as well as planting out gaps in gardens in both towns, and the Tambellup Cemetery. All dams are full, with a good amount of treated water accumulating ready for irrigation on to the Tambellup Oval over the summer period.

The rain has also held up the sealing works to be completed on Taylor St. This will be finished when a break in the weather and the contractors schedule allows.

Construction projects through July included gravel sheeting of a 5km section of Pallinup South Rd, 3km section of Beejenup Rd and repairs to Greenhills South Rd. Upcoming works include repairs to Flat Rocks Rd and gravel sheeting on Punchmirup North Rd

Maintenance grading continued through July. Roads graded included Flat Rocks Rd, Chillicup Rd, Peringillup West Rd, Pallinup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Etna Rd, Gillespie Rd, Beejenup Rd, Stock Route Rd, Poonawariup Rd, Des Wray Rd, Hassell Rd, Toolbrunup Rd and White Rd.

#### **BLOOM FESTIVAL**

Thank you to those groups who responded to the call for events for inclusion in the Bloom Festival program. The Festival runs from 16<sup>th</sup> September to 16<sup>th</sup> October, with events being held across the Hidden Treasures Shires - Woodanilling, Katanning, Kojonup, Kent, Broomehill-Tambellup, Cranbrook, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, and new member Plantagenet. 

# AUGUST 9 IS CENSUS NIGHT. OUR MOMENT TO PAUSE AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE.

#### What is the Census?

The Census of Population and Housing (Census) is Australia's largest statistical collection undertaken by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS). For more than 100 years, the Census has provided a snapshot of Australia, helping to shape our nation's education, health, transport and infrastructure.

#### When is the next Census?

The next Census will be held on August 9.

#### What does the Census mean to Australia?

The Census provides important information about Australia's people and their housing. It helps estimate Australia's population, which is used to distribute government funds and plan services for your community.

In 2016, the Census will count close to 10 million dwellings and approximately 24 million people, the largest number counted to date.

#### What should people expect this Census?

From August 1, most households will receive a letter from the ABS, addressed 'To the Resident'.

The letter will include your household's unique Census Login and instructions on how to complete the Census online, as well as directions on how to order a paper form.

#### How many people are expected to complete the Census online?

In 2016, more than 15 million people are expected to complete the Census online.

#### Why go digital?

Completing the Census online is fast, easy, secure and environmentally friendly and helps reduce the cost of the Census to the community.

#### Can I still complete a paper form?

Yes. If a household is unable to access the internet or would prefer to fill out a paper form, simply call our automated paper form request service. You will need your 12-digit Census Login from the letter you received. Paper forms must be completed and returned in the Reply Paid envelope without delay – don't wait for a Census Field Officer to collect it.

## I have received a paper form. Can I complete it online?

In some locations, households will receive a paper form upfront with the option to complete the Census online. If you're able to access the internet, just follow the simple instructions on the front of the form to complete it online.

If you complete it online, do not mail back your paper form - please recycle.

## Will personal information be shared with other government departments?

No. The personal information which you provide in the Census is not shared with any other government departments or agencies including the police, Australian Taxation Office or Centrelink.

The ABS is legally bound to protect the privacy of all Australians and will not release your information in a way that will identify any individual or household.

#### What happens to my personal information after the Census?

After data collection and processing, the ABS will remove names and addresses from other household information. Names and addresses will be stored separately and securely from other Census data. Names and addresses will be destroyed four years after collection or earlier, once there is no longer any community benefit from their retention.

#### Is the Census compulsory?

Yes. Everyone in Australia on Census night must complete the Census. It's the law.







#### Landmark WA road safety campaign launched

Member for Wagin Teny Waldron MLA has shown his support for last week's launch of the first two of five major road safety education campaigns.

Mr Waldron said the important new campaigns were launched in an "effort to change the behaviour of motorists who put West Australians lives at risk".

The first two compaigns target the very best and worst drivers and are based on some of the most extensive road safety research ever conducted in Australia.

The Zero Hero campaign recognises the 800,000 WA motorists who haven't lost a dement point in the last three years and seeks to 'normalise' that good driving,' Mr Waldron explained.

"Through these 'Zero Nerces', the State Government aims to highlight the vast majority of drivers who are doing the right thing and to encourage them to positively influence the driving of those around them, including their children, parents, triends and other loved ones," Mr Waldron said.

The second of the launched campaigns largels the Risk Takers' - those who speed, drink drive use their mobile phones and do not wear eastbelts. Data shows that in 2013, 62 'Risk Takers' were killed on WA meds.

Nationals WA candidate for Roe Peter Rundle said research showed that 'Risk Takers' seemed to endorse speeding and didn't see any of these behaviours as road safety issues.

"They just aren't motivated by possible personal injury," Mr Rundle said

"Though research indicates that they are motivated by the threat of losing their licence, subsequent loss of freedom and negative social consequences, and this second compagn reflects that."

The 'Risk Takers' campaign documents the life of 'Nate', who has lost his ficence and is forced to rely on his mother to drive him around. The campaign follows Nate over the period he has lost his ficence, as the staff reality of his new life set in.

Mr Waldron said: "This campaign aims to have those risk takers think about how their life would be negatively expected should they end up in a similar position," Mr Waldron said.

Research shows that risk tukers find this situation much more realistic, than actually dying as a result of their risky driving.

Funding of \$4 million has been allocated from the Road Trauma Trust Account to deliver the road safety education compaigns in 2016-17.

The campaigns will be shown across television, radio and online and through outdoor

Waldron encourages local governments to apply for youth scholarships

Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA is encouraging country local governments to apply for funding through the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund (CLGF) Youth Development, Program.

Mr Waldron said country local governments were now able to apply for funding through the program, which will see the creation of 20 traineeships providing young people with career prospects in their local commentees.

The trainceships are part of a \$1.2 million investment into young people in regional Western Australia, aimed at creating entry-level jobs.

"Starting a career in local government could offer local young people the chance to make positive differences in their communities and provide them with financial security and in turn job longevity," Mr Rundle said:

Mr Waldron said while supported by Royalties for Regions, this "furtisetic initiative" enabled participants to not only gain useful work skills but also encouraged them to stay in the regions through the provision of job options.

"Not only will this initiative enable participants to gain valuable skills through experience, it will enable them to stay in their community of choice."

Regional Development Minister Terry Redman said the CLOF was helping regional local governments build their capacity and identify opportunities for development.

"The Country Local Government Fund contributes towards building and maintaining a positive lifestyle for our regional communities and is an important investment for Royalties for Regions," Mr Redman said.

The CLOF Youth Development Program is one of five initiatives that has received \$5 million as funding, over two years, to improve the capacity of country local government. Under the initiative, country local government may access up to \$5000 towards course fees per trained and a \$15,000 wags subsidy. It also includes 40 scholarships of up to \$10,000 each for young country local government employees to undertake training and 30 two-day workshops on leadership and career development.

## Watering WA to secure local water sources

Government of WA Media Statement, Friday, 8 July 2016

- Building water capacity by funding new and improved infrastructure
- Supporting dryland agricultural regional communities and economies Made possible by Liberal National Government's Royalties for Regions program

A Liberal National Government plan to secure regional water supplies for community and agricultural use and support healthy, sustainable environments has been unveiled.

Water Minister Mia Davies and Regional Development Minister Terry Redman today launched Watering WA - a \$30 million initiative made possible by Royalties for Regions, with an initial focus on more than 60 local government areas from the Mid-West to the Great Southern.

"There are three key delivery areas for Watering WA - towns, farms and rural businesses, and regional waterways. Under the town component, \$21.6 million will be spent on infrastructure in regional communities to harvest, store, treat and distribute stormwater, recycled water and bore water for irrigation and community use," Ms Davies said.

"This extends the Department of Water's Community Water Supply Program (through the Rural Water Planning Program), which has funded more than 100 successful community projects in the past 20 years. Under Watering WA, grants available to towns and communities will increase by up to \$2 million, from the \$100,000 grants currently available."

Ms Davies said \$4.4 million would be available for farmers to develop and improve on-farm water supplies, continuing more than \$36 million spent in the past two decades building on-farm capacity. "Farmers will now be able to access grants of up to \$20,000 - an increase from the \$15,000 currently available under the Farm Water Rebate Scheme, including, for the first time, farmers connected to scheme water," she said.

The third component focuses on rehabilitating the regional waterways of the Avon catchment, with \$4 million allocated for a range of on-ground works.

Mr Redman said Watering WA would help regional communities continue to be attractive places to live, work and invest.

"Regional areas support a variety of industries that contribute billions of dollars to the State's GDP every year. Access to secure, reliable, local non-drinking water sources ensures our regional communities, farms and businesses can continue to grow," he said.




