The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>20th October</u> 2016 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- Council reviewed and endorsed the Standard Operating Procedures for Bush Fire Brigades.
 Copies of the reviewed document have been sent to all brigade Fire Control Officers.
- The Department of Fire and Emergency Services
 has requested Council's approval to commence
 the issue of identity cards to Shire brigade
 personnel. This has come about as an outcome of
 the Ferguson Inquiry into the Waroona and
 Esperance fires. More information will be made
 available to brigades as it becomes available.
- Main Roads WA sought Council's feedback on a proposal to amend the Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) Network rating of Tieline Road, Kimberley Street, Nardlah Road, Old Nardlah Road and Darcy Street. Council indicated its support for permanent RAV 7 Network Rating for Tieline Road (between Great Southern Highway and Nardlah Road), Kimberley Street (between Tieline Road and the entry to the CBH site), Nardlah Road, between Darcy Street and Tieline Road, and Old Nardlah Road. These were supported subject to conditions. Council did not support the amendment to the RAV Network rating for Darcy St. Main Roads WA will advise the outcome of the proposal in due course.

CBH GROUP GRASS ROOTS FUND INFRASTRUCTURE ROUND

We are pleased to advise an application to the above funding round by the Shire was successful. Funding of \$13,500 has been granted to allow for the purchase of a transfer pump to be installed at a dam off Nardlah Rd which Council has been able to access, for collection and transfer of stormwater to the dam at the Broomehill Recreational Complex. This project complements the works already completed in recent years to increase the amount of water harvested for use at the Complex.

WORKS

It has been a recurring theme in the Shire's notes throughout the year, and it goes without saying - the rain we have had this year is very much appreciated, and will make the summer maintenance of our sporting and recreation facilities less stressful, but it also has brought its own challenges, as the farming community will appreciate! Aside from the never-ending weeds that present to our parks and gardens staff, the many rainy days we have had, and water logging of open spaces has meant the gardeners have been restricted in their mowing and spraying program. Road construction maintenance has also been held up due to wet days. We are hopeful of a stretch of fine weather to enable everyone to catch up.

The footpath lights along the railway pathway in Broomehill have been repaired, with the light fittings being replaced with LED bulbs. We hope this will result in less maintenance being required. The construction crew has been working on gravel

repairs to many roads around the Shire during September, while funded road projects have been put on hold due to wet weather. The maintenance graders have been working in the south west section of the Shire, and a contract grader was engaged to carry out grading on roads in the north of the shire to assist with the backlog due to wet days. The following roads were graded by Shire graders during September: Eureka Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Pindellup Rd, Sorrento Rd, Nymbup Rd, Crosby Rd, North West Rd, Bessen Rd, Burridge Rd, Moonies Hill Rd, Peter Valley Rd, Sprigg-Simpson Rd, Nazzari Rd, Dartnall Rd and Gittens Rd.

Vegetation widening has been completed on a section of Warrenup Rd in preparation for resealing later this year. Tieline North Rd has also been widened ready for gravel resheeting.

The maintenance crew has focused on repair of bitumen edges and potholes.

NOTICE OF ROAD CLOSURE

time.

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup wishes to advise all residents that a section of Norrish St, Tambellup will be closed to all traffic on **SATURDAY 8TH OCTOBER 2016**, for the purpose of the staging of the Tambellup Show. The section which will be closed is from the Tambellup Community Resource Centre to Henry St, with the closure in effect from 6.00am – 6.00pm on this day. Any enquiries regarding the road closure can be directed to the CEO.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2016** and continues until **15 APRIL 2017** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2016** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2017** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2015. Permits to burn can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM), Cindy Pearce.

All residents should assess the fuel loads on their property, and take steps to reduce this risk well before summer. Although spraying and slashing of tall grass is an effective treatment for reducing fire risk, if it is done too late in the season the dried grass still presents as a hazard. The trucks are passing through towns and raising funds for the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) on their way.


Come and have a look at these lovely old trucks as they pull up at the layby opposite the Tambellup Hotel before carrying on with their trek to Gnowangerup.

Works are progressing on track at the Oval, with the slabs for the Pavilion and change rooms being laid, and the completion of the retaining wall on the tennis court side and around the bowling green site. The bowling green area has been filled and resembles a beach at the moment. The next couple of weeks will see the steel framework going up, and the terracing of the bank in front of the building will be started.

'A Little Bit of Monica in My Life.' by Monica Nazzari.

I feel compelled to write 'a little bit' to explain my thoughts about the creation of We Welcome Women and to introduce our first event.

lust over a year ago I was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma and to say this past year has been difficult would be an understatement. Without going into details about my medical treatment, I can safely say my 'Mind' went on a roller coast ride that I wasn't prepared for. Depression and negative emotions plagued my days and also my nights, sleep was a foreign word. While I tried to hide my feeling, my diagnoses, my treatment, my 'self from the world, the world just wouldn't listen, wouldn't leave me the *%#\$ alone.

A few friends that got past the barbwire fence that I had surrounded myself with, patiently, persistently, listened and supported me without judgement. I needed those friends and I was slowly able to talk and tell them what was in my head, even though they may have thought I was a complete 'nutter' at the time, they just listened, or changed the subject or took me out. Talk to your family I hear you say, I couldn't, it was too hard, too emotional, too raw.

There's a problem with living in a small town, everyone knows your business. There's a bonus in living in a small town, everyone knows you. I thank and am extremely grateful for each person that was in my life during that time. Every time I met someone that I knew and they smiled and we had a chat, those moments meant the world to me. I began to see all the wonderful people that surrounded me. I began to think that there may be other people around that may be the same as me, lost and in a storm that they needed help finding their way out of. So on one of the many nights that I was awake and with the help of friends ideas I thought We Welcome Women might work to help all women come together to help support each other, whether in a storm or not. Friendship, community, support, compassion, understanding, quidance, fun, laughter, exercise, wellbeing may be some of the reasons to come along.

I realise many people have busy lives, work, children etc, so we will aim to hold a variety of events during the day and night. 

Extract from Victorian Police Gazette November 6th 1878

MURDER!!

See Victoria Government Gazette, 30th October, 1878, page 2777 Murder of Police, King River District

Two Thousand Pounds Reward

Whereas on Saturday morning the 26th October, a party of four members of the police force, namely Sergeant Kennedy, and Constables McIntyre, Scanlon and Lonigan, who were in the King River District, were surrounded by four men who presented arms, and called upon the said members of the police force to surrender; and whereas Constables Lonigan and Scanlon were shot dead, McIntyre escaped to Mansfield, and Sergeant Kennedy has not yet been heard of. Notice is hereby given, that a reward of Five hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the capture of each of the said four offenders.

This notice is in lieu of that which appeared in the Supplement to the Gazette issued on Monday last, the 28th, that notification and all copies thereof being cancelled.

Description of the Offenders

Two of the four Murderers are supposed to be Edward and Daniel Kelly; of the other two, the following description has been furnished by Constable McIntyre:-

First Man: Name unknown, about 21 years of age, 5ft high, slight build, very fair complexion, whiskers, beard, and moustache, thin, mild expression of features.

Second Man: Name unknown, about 19 years of age, stout build, only a few straggling hairs on face, sinister expression.

Amended Description of Offenders

1st. Edward Kelly, 23 years of age, looks older, sallow complexion, dark brown hair, full beard and moustache of a dirty dark red colour, moustache cut square across the mouth, hazel



eyes with a greenish tint, wore dark tweed clothes, red silk sash, dark low hat.

- 2nd. Daniel Kelly, 17 years of age, looks older, 5ft. 5 or 6in high, very dark hair and complexion, small dark piercing eyes, beard not grown.
- 3rd. Name unknown, 21 years of age, 5ft 9in high, very fair complexion, fair moustache, and long beard on chin, very fine, like first growth, respectable looking, supposed identical with Charley Brown.
- 4th. Name unknown, 19 or 20 years of age, 5ft 8in high, fairish complexion, rather stout, straggling hairs over face, slightly hooked nose, sinister appearance.

The following horses, believed to have been taken from the murdered men, are described as follows;-

- 1st. Chestnut gelding, crown, M 42 like C over 2 reversed off shoulder, stout build, clipped last winter.
- 2nd. Brown mare, crown over O9 JS blotched near rump, small star, white hairs top of tail, well bred.
- $3^{\rm rd}.$ Bay mare, crown over P 38 J R O over 142 near shoulder, hind feet white.
- $4^{\rm th}.$ Bay gelding, B 87, bell brand over D near shoulder, rather hollow back.
- 5th. Bay gelding, P 183 off shoulder, WS near shoulder. Supposed another police horse, no description at present. The watch taken from deceased Sergeant Kennedy is described as follows:- a gold hunting lever, No 28345, Jackson, London, maker, W. H. and S. inside case, M.K. outside case; value £50, brass chain and small locket attached. 5th November 1878
