



The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>16th June 2016</u> commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

The May meeting provided another opportunity for Council to become familiar with the Policy Manual, with a number of existing policies reviewed and two new policies adopted. Council is required to review all policies at least every three years. Policies provide for consistency and equity in decision making, promptness in responding to customer needs and operational efficiency.

Council endorsed the appointment of Ben Hewson as Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and Ian Cunningham and Wayne Newbey as Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officers for 2016/17 and 2017/18. Council also endorsed the appointments of Brigade Fire Control Officers for 2016-2017:

Broomehill East - Gavin Guerini

Broomehill West - Warrick McMahon

Broomehill Central - Lara Hugill

Tambellup East - Kim Oliver

Tambellup West – Jarrod Thorn

Tambellup VFES - Laurie Hull

Thanks are extended to these people for taking on the challenge of these roles.

Council also discussed the practice adopted to date of formally appointing Dual Fire Control Officers to act at incidents crossing Shire boundaries. Due to an inconsistent approach taken to these appointments within the region, Council has determined that formal appoints will not be made, and the provisions of s.39A (2) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* will apply – that is, a brigade FCO or member may take charge of a bush fire incident in an adjoining Shire if a brigade FCO or member of that Shire is not present. This practice has also been adopted by our neighbours.

Council endorsed the 2016-2017 Fire Break Order and Information booklet. The booklet will be distributed with rates notices early in the new financial year.

With budget deliberations looming, a number of significant documents have been reviewed to ensure information is accurate. Firstly, Council reviewed the Ten Year Plant Replacement Program. The plan has been developed to give Council an overview of the future requirements of the organisation and has been incorporated into the Long Term Financial Plan and Corporate Plan. It plays a major role in the asset management plan and includes estimates for future replacement costs, which assists with development of the annual budget.

Council also reviewed the Functional Road Hierarchy. The road hierarchy is just one of the tools that assist Council in setting the priorities for its road construction and road maintenance program and the annual budget requirements. The road hierarchy takes into consideration a number of factors, including physical traffic counts, and Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) ratings. An annual review is undertaken to ensure that the priority assigned to each road is still relevant and to make any amendments to the hierarchy that have become apparent since the last review

Council considered and supported three requests for proposals to amend RAV ratings on roads in the Shire:

- Amend the section of Warrenup Road between Albany Highway and the intersection of Nookanellup Road from Network 3 to Network 4, subject to conditions;
- Amend the section of Nookanellup Road between Warrenup Road and the Broomehill Kojonup Road from Network 3 to Network 4, subject to conditions; and
- Amend the RAV rating of Tie Line Rd between Great Southern Highway and the Gnowangerup Shire boundary from existing Networks 3, 4 and 5 to Network 7 with conditions.

Main Roads WA will be advised of Councils support for these proposals and will carry out the required assessments of the roads.

WORKS

Well, what can we say. The dams are full! The gardeners have recently taken delivery of their latest plant order, and will be busy planting to fill bare spots over coming weeks, while managing the inevitable weeds that come with the rain.

Sealing and kerbing on Taylor St in Tambellup is still to be completed. We are hopeful this will be finished early in June, including correction of some of the driveway kerbing.

Katanning Cherry Pickers have been in town during May, trimming trees under powerlines in the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites.

The construction crew finished sealing works on South Pallinup Rd (2.85km) and resealing on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd (3.5km) during May. Both jobs were funded by Regional Roads Group funding. Other road projects to be completed prior to the end of June are gravel sheeting on Beejenup Road, Punchmirup North Rd and Norrish Road. These works are funded by Roads to Recovery. Motorists in the area of these works are asked to observe signage on site and drive to the conditions.

Under the terms of the Western Australian Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements funding approved following the flood event in January, the Shire was required to tender the road repairs and reinstatement of damaged roads. Riverhill Contracting was awarded the tender and will be commencing works in the near future.

The maintenance graders have been working in the south eastern part of the shire where some roads required grading after the flood damage. While shire graders were in the southern part, two contract graders were bought in to help grade roads in the north of the shire.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE

Residents may soon see some activity at the Pavilion, with the tender for the construction being considered at the May Council meeting and awarded to Wauters Enterprises (Pavilion construction and overall site works) and Evergreen Synthetic Grass (bowling green). Both companies submitted competitive prices, and are highly regarded in their respective industries. We look forward to a positive working relationship and an excellent end result in both areas.

Aside from the excitement of the imminent construction activity, other matters involving the management of the new facility will take precedence for the Tambellup Sports Pavilion Advisory Committee. Council's preference is for a Management Committee to be established to take over the management of the facility on completion, and to assist in the transition, the Advisory Committee will be working through the governance requirements and processes that the incoming committee will need. We are fortunate to have a number of successful management models within our neighbouring communities to look to, and these committees have indicated they are willing to share their experiences. This assistance is greatly appreciated.

Last month we advised that 3D drawings of the new facility would be available for perusal at the Shire office in Tambellup. Unfortunately these have been delayed, but the architects have assured us they will be on hand in the very near future. Residents are welcome to call in and check out the plans — when they arrive!!

BLOOM FESTIVAL

Hidden Treasures of the Great Southern is calling for expressions of interest in organisation of events through the region during the 2016 Bloom Festival. In 2015, the 'Blooms of Broomehill' photographic exhibition was held at the Henry Jones Winery and Café, with 'wildflower hotspot' maps available, and the Cake Decorating ladies created a beautifully realistic display of icing flowers, which were on display at the Tambellup CRC.

What can we do to showcase our district for 2016?? Some other events held over the past few years have included wildflower displays, wildflower walks and drives, open gardens, markets, art and craft exhibitions, long table lunches, guided bush tucker walks, flower arranging and propagation workshops, dawn and dusk guided bird and bush walks — and all with a 'Bloom' theme.

An evaluation of the Festival completed following the 2015 event found 11,240 people attended the events over the two week period. It would be great to see Broomehill and Tambellup feature in the program once again this year.



COOKING WITH CHILDREN

ood regional pensioners will continue to benefit from the Country Age Pension Fuel Card, anks to a further investment of \$140.1 million over the next four years through the State overnment's Royalties for Regions program.

Eleven new weather stations have been installed across the State, including three new stations in the Wagin electrate providing more accurate information shead of grain season, thanks to Royaltes for Regions (RIR).

- Facey Group, Wickepin Sourthern DIRT, Kojonup and West Arthur Trials Group, Darkan
- Stirlings to Coast Farmers, Mount Barker and Gillamii Centre, Cranbrook

Regional Development Minister Terry Redman said the eConnected Grainbeit project would enable the agricultural sector to meet growing demand and strengthen regional communities where agriculture was a major economic activity.

The project is connecting growers to the information they need to make appropriate decisions that are tailored for their paddocks, their business, and the variable conditions they face each season," Mr Redman said.

Cranbrook Motocross Officials Training

Severe weather warning dampened the motocross rider participation at the last Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club Day on Saturday 21st May, with only 21 riders racing. With a delayed start digging channels to drain the Rockwell Flats track and the day being cut short with the flaggies and riders bitterly cold and wet, it seems that yes motocross is definitely a winter sport!



For those of you who would like to become more involved with Cranbrook motocross then flagging and spectating Motorcycling WA our affiliated body is offering officials training courses in Cranbrook in June or July this year. Officials are the backbone of all motocross clubs and without them the day could not function. There are four main officials at each competitive event being, Steward, Clerk of Course, Race Secretary and Bike Scrutineers all positions require Motorcycling WA training every four years or proof of participation in that role.

The Race Secretary is the person responsible for the organization and pre event and post event management of a race meeting. The Race Secretary is responsible for affiliation, permits and licencing and checks that the motocross rider has filled out the entry and indemnity form correctly and has a valid licence. This is all done prior to racing so plenty of time to watch the day's events!

Scrutineer/Machine Examiner is the person responsible to ensure that every competing motorbike conforms to the regulations stipulated by Motorcycling WA and the event. The scrutineer also inspects all helmets and riding apparel to

ensure compliance. This is also all done prior to racing so plenty of time to watch the day's events also!

Clerk of Course is the person responsible for the actual running of a race meeting. He or she ensures that the meeting is conducted in accordance with the Motorcycling WA policies and is responsible for all issues of safety. The Clerk of Course conducts the riders brief (meeting) prior to the commencement of the day.

The Steward is the "Top Dog" on the race day. All officials are answerable to him/her and their primary job is to handle disputes.

Broomehill Historical News

November 1 1893 Inquests.

Broome Hill - on the 23rd October, at the "imperial" Hotel, before W.K Adam, R.M. and Coroner touching the destruction by fire a store occupied by Rudolph Krakouer, at Broome Hill, on the 22nd October. Verdict – "Cause of fire unknown."

July 25 1894 Horses, Cattle, &c.

Broome Hill – Stolen on or about the 23rd June, bay horse, aged, about 14 hands high, scar on nose or forehead, branded HH conjoined under half circle on near shoulders; and dark brown mare, saddle-branded C8 on near shoulder, with foal at foot, the property of Wm Edward Foley.

Wednesday April 10 1895 Stealing from dwellings and person %c.

Broome Hill – Between the 21st and 28th March, gold shaped trinket, engraved with Chinese characters and ornamented with diamonds in centre and two pearls at each corner, the property of Heng Key.

August 7 1895 INQUEST

Katanning – On the 29th July at the "Imperial" Hotel Broome Hill, before W. K. Adam, R.M and coroner, touching the death of John Nicholson, found dead on the Broome Hill-Eticup road on the 28th July. Verdict – "Accidental death, through his horse carrying him against the limb of a tree."

(PC Nicholson stationed at Broome Hill)

June 3 1896 Stealing from dwellings, people &c.

Broome Hill – On the 23rd May while in transit by post between Broome Hill and Albany – order for £5 drawn by W Brown, payable to bearer, dated 23-5-96 No 6, endorsed "Lord Brassey, Goblup Estate, J. F. T.

Hassell, agent", the property of W Brown.

June 24 1896

Broome Hill – The money order described, the property of W Brown, has been found, not stolen.

April 20 1898 PROPERTY LOST

Broome Hill - On the 11th March – a cheque for £3 on the W.A. Bank, drawn by E.H Absalom in favour of William Betteridge; the property of Thomas Maguire.

March 22 1899 PROPERTY LOST

Broomehill – On the 5th March – a gentleman's silver hunting English lever watch by Ehrardt No. 121331; the property of Wm A Newby.

June 28 1899 INQUESTS

On the 21st June at the Police Station before W. K. Adam, R.M, Acting Coroner, touching the fire which occurred at the Alpha Hall on the 20th June. Verdict – "Fire caused by spontaneous combustion."

Stealing from dwellings, people &c November 22 1899

Broomehill – On the 27th October, from the Imperial Hotel stables – a gentleman's riding saddle much worn but in good condition, weight 16lbs., flat stiff knee pads lined with striped calico, branded "Wilson Robe" on flap, nearly new, leather girth, odd stirrup irons (one round other square), stirrup leathers much worn; property of Frederick Belney. Suspicion attaches to Richard McGee, described as thin build, age 27 years, height 5ft 9in, dark hair and moustache, dark complexion, thin visage, wiry appearance; believed to have gone to Kendenup or Mt Barker shearing.

January 3 1900

Broomehill - The saddle described, the property of Frederick Belney has been recovered in Katanning by P.C. J. S. Foulkes, having been taken in error.

Stealing from dwellings, people &c March 28 1900 Broomehill – Between the 3rd and 17th March from Goblup Station – 4 merino full fleeces of wool, branded "B" on near side, weight about 40lbs; the property of Alex Morrison Nicholson.






