#### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council accepted the auditor's report for the 2014-2015 financial year. No matters of concern or items requiring review were identified by the auditors.

Council adopted the Annual Report for 2014-2015, and determined that the Annual Electors Meeting will be held on 8 December 2015, commencing at 7.00pm in the Council Chambers.

Council formally appointed Emily Hardie as its delegate to the Hidden Treasures of the Great Southern Committee. Thank you Emily for your enthusiasm in this role!

Council endorsed the 'Local Emergency Management Plan for the Provision of Welfare Support' as

presented by the Local Emergency Management Committee. The Plan, which was developed by the Department for Child Protection and Family Services, sets out procedures for provision of welfare support in the event of an emergency situation within the community.

Council granted approval to Formosa Flora to collect native seed from Council managed reserves and road reserves within the Shire, subject to a number of conditions relating to collection practices, and use of the seed within the region.

Council considered two requests seeking support for applications to Main Roads Heavy Vehicle Services to amend Restricted Access Vehicle ratings for Nardlah Rd and a section of Crosby Rd.

In accordance with the ten year Plant Replacement Program, Council endorsed the specifications for the purchase of a new grader to replace its Caterpillar 12H grader. The purchase of the new grader, and the 'sale by tender' of the old grader, will be coordinated by the Western Australian Local Government Association through its preferred supplier service. Council also considered quotes received for the purchase of a new small truck to allow for transportation of the skid steer and other items of equipment.

#### **WORKS UPDATE**

The construction crew is currently working on Toolbrunup Rd, re-gravelling a section which has been funded by Roads to Recovery. Once complete, the crew will move on to other gravel repair jobs in the area. In the New Year, the program will include the construction and sealing of a section of South Pallinup Rd, re-gravelling of a 9km section of Punchmirup Rd when vegetation widening is complete, and re-gravelling on sections of Norrish Rd where vegetation widening has been completed.

The maintenance graders are working their way down the western side of the Shire, with roads graded during November including Broomehill-Kojonup Rd (bitumen edges), Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Nookanellup Rd, North Nookanellup Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Holly East Rd, Holding Rd, Mattiske Rd, Parnell Rd, Moore Rd, Wandoo Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, White Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Bridge St and Donald St.

The maintenance crew are continuing to maintain culverts and head walls, and signage across the shire. Water levels in Council's dams are being closely monitored, particularly in Broomehill, where levels are low for this time of the year. Watering is being undertaken conservatively at this stage. In Tambellup, treated waste water is being used to irrigate the Oval, with good supplies available.

#### **SHADE SAILS**

As some residents may be aware, some of the shade sails at Holland Park have been taken down. During a period of high winds some weeks ago, two poles were bent and four sails damaged, all of which will require repair or replacement.

The cost to have this work carried out (including reinstallation) is significant, and Council is currently considering its options for the provision of shade over the playground. We would ask for resident's patience as we work towards an acceptable solution.

Councillors and staff at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup wish all residents a happy and relaxed Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

#### **TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE**

Thank you to those who took the time to call in at the office to inspect the plans for the Pavilion and provide feedback. The comment period has now closed, and all feedback received has been noted for consideration by the Tambellup Sports Pavilion Advisory Committee and Council.

We hope to be able to finalise the building and bowling green plans, and the overall site plan during December and January, with a view to advertising the tender for construction early in the New Year. Once the tender process is underway, the focus for the Committee will change to the future management of the facility, and the development of the management structure. Council's preference is for the facility to be managed by a committee with representation from sporting clubs, the community and Council. Fortunately we have several successful models of management in neighbouring communities that we are able to reference. We hope to have the management structure in place before the building program is completed so the new Management Committee can be appointed and take over the reins early.

#### **CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS**

The Shire Offices will close at **12 noon** on **Thursday 24 December 2015** and reopen again at 8.30am on **Monday 4 January 2016**. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers Licensing services available at either office during that period.

Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Friday 18 December 2015. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas period.

Rubbish and recycling collections will be carried out as normal over the Christmas/New Year period. The weekly rubbish collection will be carried out on

Thursday 24 December and Thursday 31 December. The fortnightly recycling collection will be carried out on Thursday 24 December. Contractors have requested that bins be put out earlier than normal, as they may be running early.

Any urgent matters during the Christmas and New Year period can be referred to the CEO – Joanne Trezona on 9825 1114.

#### HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

The safety of our community during harvest and the fire season is of paramount concern, and the Chief, Deputy and Brigade Fire Control Officers communicate regularly to monitor conditions, imposing bans on harvesting and vehicle movement in paddocks when required. These calls are not made lightly, however they are essential to reduce the risk of fire in our district.

Harvest and vehicle movement bans are communicated to residents by Council in a number of ways:

**Harvest Ban Hotline:** Residents can phone **98251042** 24/7 to hear pre-recorded information about the status of harvest and vehicle movement bans. This is the most up to date and reliable source of information available.

Harvest Ban SMS: Residents can register their mobile phone number with the Shire, to receive notification of imposing and lifting of harvest and vehicle movement bans, road closures and other emergency information. To register your number for these notifications, please contact Kim at the Shire on 9825 3555. Please be aware that not all areas of the shire experience full mobile signal, and this may result in notifications being delayed. For this reason the SMS system should not be relied on as a sole source of information.

Local Radio: Harvest and vehicle movement ban information is broadcast on ABC radio at 10.05am, 11.05am, 12.35pm and 2.05pm, and on RadioWest 1071 at various times during the day. While every effort is made to ensure local information is provided to the radio stations for broadcast at these times, weather conditions can change quickly, and bans may need to be imposed at relatively short notice. Again, please do not rely on this as a sole source of information.


Residents are directed to the Harvest Ban Hotline – 98251042 – as the most up to date and reliable source of information. If you think the weather conditions have deteriorated to the point where you feel it is unsafe to continue harvesting – make a judgement call and STOP – whether a ban has been imposed or not.

Precious time is lost if you try to contact volunteer ambulance officers at their home for the ambulance. The volunteer may not be available for the call, not in town

The ambulance cannot be dispatched to the emergency unless the request goes through the State Operations Centre (SOC) so even if you phone a volunteer privately they cannot attend unless they get the call from SOC.




#### LANDMARK/WFI 4S BOWLS








## Broomehill Library

Emergency Services Volunteer Fuel Card to help volunteer groups by February

The Royalties for Regions Emergency Service Volunteer Fuel Card (ESVFC) will be rolled out in February next year, after a recent announcement of the application process timeline.

The Fuel Card, a Nationals WA election commitment, was announced earlier this year and will provide eligible brigades, groups and units (BGUs) with a \$2000 fuel card each year to support their services and volunteers.

Applications open on Monday November 23 and will need to be submitted by Sunday January 10, with the first fuel cards to be sent out in February next year.

Nationals Members for the Agricultural Region, Hon Martin Aldridge MLC said the announcement came just in time for BGUs and residents preparing for the rapidly approaching fire season.

"The ESVFC is about providing emergency service volunteers, who often dip into their own pockets to help others, with a bit of support," Mr Aldridge said.

"This announcement is timely given summer is a particularly busy period fo many of our regional volunteers."

Mr Aldridge, who has a wealth of experience in the emergency services sector, drove the ESVFC policy heading into the last election and has advocated for its swift introduction since his election in 2013.

He said the parameters around provision of the card would ensure the benefits ended up with volunteers

"Responsibility for distributing the ESVFC amongst active, registered volunteers of the BGU will fall with the officer-in-charge," Mr Aldridge said.

"This ensures the fuel card will be fairly distributed to contributing volunteers."

The ESVFC is restricted to private or recreational fuel purchases only and must not be used to purchase fuel for an operational vehicle or vessel.

#### New garden to delight the senses of Kerry Lodge residents

A delightful garden designed to stimulate the senses of Kerry Lodge residents has transformed what was once a drab central courtyard at the Katanning aged care facility.

The sensory garden was officially opened on Monday 9 November after a year of careful planning, design and installation by Kerry Lodge staff, residents and their families.

Kerry Lodge is operated by the WA Country Health Service Great Southern and the garden installation was partly funded under the Royalties for Regions' half a billion dollar Southern Inland Health Initiative which is providing a significant boost to aged care through a number of initiatives throughout the Wheatbelt and Great Southern regions.

Southern Inland Health Initiative's Aged Care Improvement Coordinator Christine Hunter said former Kerry Lodge manager, Sue Ham originally saw the opportunity to convert the disused space into a place of enjoyment for residents of the lodge, particularly those who are living with dementia.

"Sensory gardens provide myriad benefits to aged care residents and people living with dementia, as they activate all the senses and can trigger memories," Ms Hunter said.

"They can be very calming spaces to simply sit and can offer a pleasant environment to reminisce about life, while visitors smell, touch and taste plants from the garden.

"In the garden we have created there are colourful and unusual plants to look at and touch, fragrant plants to smell, a veggie patch full of lettuce, snow peas, cherry tomatoes, strawberries and herbs, textured plants and materials to touch, a water misting system for hot days, and a water feature and wind chimes to provide soothing sounds.

"Working in the garden deadheading flowers or planting new seedlings also provides a sense of purpose and a physical outlet for the residents involved in maintaining the garden."

Kerry Lodge staff and members of the local District Health Advisory Committee received training from the

Dementia Training Study Centre based in New South Wales, and also visited several gardens in Mt Barker and Albany to help design the garden.

Residents and their families were also invited to give their thoughts about what could be included in the garden.

The sensory garden has been made possible with funding from the Royalties for Regions funded Southern Inland Health Initiative, the Albany Aged and Subacute Care team, the Katanning Hospital Patient Comforts Fund, the Katanning Hospital Donations Account, Rotary Club of Katanning, National Seniors Club (Katanning branch), and the Badgebup CWA. In kind donations were also made by residents and their families, members of the District Health Advisory Council and the surrounding community.

#### **SWOOPING MAGPIES AND SLITHERING SNAKES**

It's the magpie and snake season once again. Parks and Wildlife receive numerous calls from the community about swooping magpies and the movement of snakes' especially this time of year.

Simple steps can be taken to avoid being in situations that can be very frightening. Feel free to use this information in your community news and school newsletters.

Magpies are widespread, conspicuous birds commonly seen around. Their breeding season is generally between August and December, lasting up to six to eight weeks and they are protective of their nest within a 100m radius. During this time the magpies may swoop what appears to them as intruders.

The following steps can be taken to avoid or reduce the impact of swooping magpies:

- Wearing of a wide rim hat and eye protection
- Don't look up
- Take an alternative route to your destination
- Wear a helmet if riding a bike or be taken via a car during the season
- Never deliberately provoke or harass a magpie as they become more defensive and have long memories.

Snakes are another common fear of people and are found everywhere, generally showing up in backyards, homes and yards.

Now that the warm weather is upon us this brings the snakes and other reptiles out and about, foraging for food. Generally the snakes are just as scared of us as we are to them. Snakes are very mobile at the moment and generally will not stay in one location for too long.

The following steps can be taken to avoid and reduce the impact of snakes around where we live and work:

- Ensuring that your bird and chicken enclosures are regularly cleaned
- Controlling of any mice or rat problems
- Be aware and take care in bush land and grassy areas
- Walk and /or cycle on cleared areas only
- When out bushwalking, wear long trousers and boots or other enclosed footwear that preferably covers the ankles to reduce the risk of being bitten
- Keep a watchful eye on the ground about a metre ahead of where you are walking and avoid entering areas of long grass, rushes and undergrowth
- Spring clean time around the house, property and or work place by keeping your yard clean of long grass (lawns mowed low) and items that provide cover such as stacks of timber, rocks, corrugated iron, compost heaps or discarded household items
- Dog owners are urged to take extra care when walking their beloved pets, as dogs rarely survive a venomous snake bite unless veterinary treatment is given as soon as possible
   Ensure that there is little opportunity for snakes to enter your home by keeping doors shut, fitting weather seals to doors and blocking any gaps or cracks

# Innovative language program finalist at Health Awards

Kindergarten students at thirteen schools in the Central Great Southern have been benefiting from a program which was a finalist at the recent WA Health Excellence Awards.

The Kindergarten Oral Language Program (KOLP), a partnership between the WA Country Health Service and Young Men's Christian Association WA (YMCAWA), was introduced in 2013 in an effort to improve the oral language skills of young children across the region, as part of the Royalties for Regions funded Southern Inland Health Initiative.

WACHS Speech Pathologist Jan Batchelor said the program has received extremely positive feedback from teachers, and that student progress has been significant.

"All schools have seen a marked improvement in the number of children achieving language benchmarks. One school saw a jump from 22% of children reaching benchmark before the program commenced to 100% afterwards.

"Strong oral language skills are directly related to well children will do with their reading, spelling and writing, so this program will make an incredible difference to their future progress."

Between 160-180 children have participated in the KOLP each year since it was introduced. On average, around 30 Aboriginal children, 35-40 children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and 55-60 children identified with speech and language difficulties have participated.

The program is incorporated into usual classroom teaching activities and involves the entire class, which means it engages with children who may not otherwise access speech pathology services.

"We entered the KOLP into the Overcoming Inequities category of the 2015 WA Health Awards as it helps to address the issues children and families face in accessing speech pathology services in rural areas," said Mrs Batchelor.

"Speech pathology services are a finite resource, and as such, children with only mild to moderate language delay may have to wait up to a year to see a speech pathologist or may need to travel to access services. This program means we can support a wide number of children with language delayed in the classroom, while our speech pathologists can continue to focus on the children with high needs."

YMCA WA Family Engagement Manager, Amber Lee said that early education is a key focus area for the YMCA WA.

"We believe we can achieve tremendous long-term impact with this program. The YMCA WA believes that investing in supporting children to transition into school is a very important aspect of child development," said Mrs Lee.

The KOLP was developed and implemented by team including speech pathologists and therapy assistants from WACHS and YMCAWA. The team worked with classroom teachers from participating schools to integrate a range of tools, resources and activities into their everyday classroom teaching.

The half a billion dollar Southern Inland Health Initiative is funded by the State Government's Royalties for Regions program and is the single biggest investment in regional health care in WA history.

#### **Bushfires and water supplies**

2015/'16 Bushfire Season



#### Do not rely on scheme water supplies during a bushfire

Residents living in or near bushland are reminded <u>not to rely on public water supplies if they plan</u> to stay and defend their homes during a bushfire.

If you plan to defend your home, scheme water may not be available due to damaged infrastructure, extreme demand depleting supply and pressure, or a cut to power which is used to pump water.

We really want to get the message out to everyone who may be affected by bushfires that their usual public water supply may not be available. Residents need to have an independent water supply, such as a concrete or steel tank with a minimum 20,000 litre capacity.

There are other aspects to think of too, such as what to do if you lose power, what generator you will need, what pipes and fittings you will need as well as length and type of fire hoses.

We have made our own preparations for bushfire season by readying equipment and systems to cope with extreme conditions. Despite these efforts, it is likely there will be a reduction in water pressure, and scheme water supply tanks may run empty in the event of fire.

#### Grants now open for local community NRM groups

Regional volunteer groups with an interest in caring for Western Australia's natural resources may now apply for grants to grow their capability through the State Natural Resource Management (NRM) program.

Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA said new Community Capability Grants were now open to provide vital support to groups that were committed to protecting and enhancing our State's natural assets.

"Local not-for-profit organisations often play a very important role in supporting the work of Natural Resource Management volunteers," Mr Waldron said.

"These grants are designed to boost the capability and human capital of community NRM groups in order to achieve better environmental outcomes."

Mr Waldron said the State Government had allocated \$9.2 million over three years for the grants scheme, including \$7.364 million through the Royalties for Regions program.

Regional Development Minister Terry Redman said the grants would support community based, not-for-profit NRM organisations to access services or resources to improve the governance and management performance of their organisations.

"Significant NRM outcomes have been achieved since the program began in 2009 and I am pleased Royalties for Regions continues supporting the vital work carried out by local groups across the State," Mr Redman said.

"This is another example of Royalties for Regions investing in community-based projects to support a better quality of life in regional WA and enable regions to grow and contribute to a stronger economy"

The Community Capability Grants provides two funding options: large projects more than \$10,000 and up to \$1 million, with a time frame of up to two and a half years; small projects between \$1,000 and \$10,000, with a time frame of up to 12 months.

The grants are part of a \$24 million funding commitment over three years towards State

Applications for large projects close on January 18, 2016, while applications for small projects close on May 30, 2016, unless fully subscribed.




