COUNCIL ELECTIONS

The nomination period for the 2015 Council elections closed on the 10th September. Nominations for the three vacancies were received from incumbents Cr Garry Sheridan and Cr Scott Thompson, and new candidate Michael White. All three were elected unopposed for a four year term expiring in 2019. Congratulations are extended to Garry, Scott and Michael for their commitment to their community. The new (and returning) Councillors will be sworn in at an upcoming Council meeting.

Retiring Councillor Kym Crosby did not re-nominate in this election, and we thank him for his contribution to the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, and previously the Shire of Broomehill.

WORKS UPDATE

The Royalties for Regions-funded Storm Water Harvesting project recently received approval for a variation, to allow for the expansion of an existing dam opposite the CBH site on Nardlah Rd. This dam will capture overflow from the settling pond on the CBH site, which will then be transferred via the pipeline to the dam at the Recreation Complex. Another variation was approved for the expansion of the Bowling Club dam on Jam Creek Rd, and connection of this dam to the storage tanks at the Tambellup Sports Ground. Council appreciates the assistance provided by the Department for Regional Development in enabling these projects to be implemented. It is anticipated that the earthworks will commence in the near future.

The maintenance graders have been working in the north east part of the Shire during September. Roads graded included Heron Rd, Norrish Rd, Gillespie Rd, Martinup Rd, Marshall Rd, Curnow Rd, Thompson Rd, Graham Rd, Fletcher Rd and Winspear Rd. During October the graders will be heading to the western side of the Shire.

Another significant event in our region, the 2015 National Rally of the Caravan and Motorhome Club of Australia, will be held in Albany from 26th October – 1st November 2015. The event will see hundreds of participants with their recreational vehicles making their way from around the country to Albany during the weeks before and after these dates. Centennial Oval will be transformed into a giant campground for the duration of the rally, and the region will be a hive of tourism activity.

We welcome all visitors to the Great Southern, especially to Broomehill-Tambellup, and hope they enjoy their stay. With the extra traffic expected on major roads throughout the region, we would also caution all motorists to take extra time and care on the roads, exercise patience, courtesy and common sense, and make sure that we all get to where we need to go – safely!

BETTER PRACTICE REVIEW

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE

As advised in the September BT Times, Council is seeking expressions of interest from people in the community who may be interested in assisting with the next stage of the project. We are looking for up to six people who will work with Council to:

- Assist with development of management processes

- Provide input and seek feedback from community groups on matters associated with the construction of the new facility.

This committee will be established for a fixed term, which will end on handover of the new facility to the new Management Committee. It is anticipated the committee will meet towards the end of October 2015 to consider the revised plans for the Pavilion, prior to them being made available for public inspection and comment. Once the construction is complete the management will be handed over to the Management Committee and your work will be done! RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2015** and continues until **1 NOVEMBER 2015** inclusive when the Prohibited burning period commences. During the Restricted burning period you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires. HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. MOSQUITOES

And they're back! Mosquitoes are always an issue in our Shire during spring and early summer. Council baits pools of water and will undertake regular fogging of the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites in an effort to reduce the mosquito numbers. Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health has advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self-draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.




Broomehill Historical Society and carers of the Broomehill Museum have this year completed a significant assessment of the old farming machinery held in the old shire shed in the museum grounds.



Is your dog microchipped?

The *Dog Act 1976* provides that on and after 1 November 2015, the owner of a dog that has reached three months of age must ensure that the dog is microchipped.

How do I get my dog microchipped?

A veterinarian (vet), veterinarian nurse or a person with the relevant qualifications from a registered training provider is able to implant a microchip in your dog.

To find out how you can arrange for your dog to be microchipped, contact your regular vet or local government to obtain information on where you can take your dog to be microchipped.



My dog is old and unwell, is it still required to be microchipped?

A dog is exempt from the microchipping requirement if a vet issues a certificate stating that the implantation of a microchip in the dog may adversely affect the health and welfare of the dog.

Such a certificate cannot apply in respect of a dog that is under three months of age.

When will I be required to prove my dog is microchipped?

When you re-register your dog, you will be required to provide proof that the dog has been microchipped, by providing the local government with the microchip number.

How will microchipping my dog assist me?

If you lose your microchipped dog, it will make it easier for you to be reunited. The dog's microchip can be scanned by the ranger or a vet, which will reveal the owner's contact details.

If your dog is impounded and it is discovered that it has not been microchipped, you may be liable for a fine. As a result, it is in your best interests to ensure your dog is microchipped.

What happens if I do not get my dog microchipped?

A person who fails to ensure their dog is microchipped on and after 1 November 2015 is liable for a fine of up to \$5,000.

Precious time is lost if you try to contact volunteer ambulance officers at their home for th ambulance. The volunteer may not be available for the call, not in town .

The ambulance cannot be dispatched to the emergency unless the request goes through the State Operations Centre (SOC) so even if you phone a volunteer privately they cannot attend unless they get the call from SOC.

So if you need the ambulance stay calm, ring 000 and answer their questions and take their advice.




Well done Broomehill Netball Team





Cranbrook Motocross Risk Management

It seems that 'Risk Management', usually thought of in a business environment, can also be applied to the sporting arena, as highlighted by Rick Gill Executive Director of Motorcycling WA when he met with the Cranbrook District Motorcycle Club Inc. committee members on Tuesday 15th September.

Risk management was a Motorcycling WA 'hot topic' at their AGM held on 30th March 2015, and Rick is visiting and presenting at all 45 Motorcycling WA affiliated clubs, which includes the disciplines of super cross, vintage, endure, bike speedway. Although not mandatory, a formal documented club risk management policy is highly recommended by Motorcycling WA.

So what exactly is risk management? It is the course of action key people, including committee members, management, and volunteers, take to reduce potential legal liability and seeks to address potential problems before they occur. Risk management aims to be pro-active rather reactive – creating a safer environment and legally safer operational procedures.

Rick Gills presentation covered four areas of concern to motorcycling clubs. These were, the constitution, officials Working With Children check and Motorcycling WA training, accountability to Motorcycling WA and of monetary records, and lastly management of the club assets (vehicles used to maintain the track are serviced and safe.)

He then went on to say that risk management was really an ongoing process that should be applied to all Cranbrook DMCC policies and procedures. Motorcycling WA has compiled a list of thirty recommended areas and suggested that there be two focus area discussed at each committee meeting to spread the workload and maintain a 'live' risk management document.

A good 'live' risk management plan ensures good governance when handing on committee roles, in addition to the benefits of improved safety, budget certainty, effective management of events, improved compliance with the affiliated body and law and enhanced club image and reputation. Important Changes to the 2015/2016 Fire Break Order.

There have been a number of blocks of land close to town sites that have been covered with long dry grass during the summer period.

Local fire fighters raised concern last year with the Bushfire Advisory Committee regarding the length of this grass and the impact it would have on fighting a fire as well as fire fighter safety if a fire was to start on one of these blocks.

Council considered recommendations put forward by the Bushfire Advisory and the following change was implemented to limit grass height on land under the following zonings.

Extract from the 2015 / 2016 Fire Break Notice

Land Zoned Residential, Town Centre, Industrial

(Townsite Land)

During the period from 31st October 2015 to 15th April 2016 inclusive you shall have fire breaks in the following positions:

On land which is 4000 square metres (one acre) or less in area, you shall remove all flammable material from the whole of the land, except living standing trees.

Land which exceeds 4000 square metres

Land which exceeds 4000 square metres (one acre) or more of area clear fire breaks not less than 2 metres completely surrounding and not more than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage area situated on the land.

The height of all grass on the land is to be less than 150mm in height.

Land Zoned Rural Residential /Special Rural

(Townsite and Suburban Areas)

During the period from the 31st October 2015 to 15th April 2016 inclusive you shall have fire breaks in the following positions:

Clear fire breaks not less than 2 metres completely surrounding and not more than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land.

Minimise fire hazardous material to the satisfaction of the Chief Fire Control Officer by stocking, slashing or other means. The height of all grass on the land is to be less than 150mm in height. Properties will be inspected and orders may be issued.

Property compliance is required by the 1st November.

Local Fire Break Contractors have been notified of the changes to assist them in their works program. If you require further clarification or details please contact your local Fire Control Officer or Cindy Pearce the Shires Community Emergency Services Manager on 0417 071 567.

Equipment subsidies available for regional clubs

Sporting clubs in the Wagin electorate will get a chance to freshen up their equipment stocks in time for summer codes thanks to the Community Sporting Club Equipment Subsidy Scheme.

Applications for the Royalties for Regions-funded scheme are now open, giving regional sporting clubs the chance to receive a one-off \$500 subsidy for shared sporting equipment accessible to all club members.

Local MP Terry Waldron said the scheme was part of the \$2 million Supporting Community Sport initiative, which also comprises the Athlete Travel Subsidy Scheme.

"Together these two Royalties for Regions programs are helping regional sporting club members stay active and strive to do their best in their code of choice," Mr Waldron said.

"Keeping equipment up to date and in a safe condition for use is important for those participating in club sport, whether it be at training or on game day."

To date, 770 regional clubs have benefited from a total of \$385,000 in equipment subsidies made available through the scheme.

The subsidy may be used to help in the purchase of a wide range of equipment from bats and balls, uniforms and protective gear to first aid kits, shade tents and line markers.

Sport and Recreation Minister Mia Davies said a number of clubs had been able to field more teams because they had more equipment to use.

Regional Development Minister Terry Redman said the subsidy would assist clubs to provide the equipment they required to keep pace with the growing population in regional WA.

"Sporting equipment is costly and this investment will provide support for regional residents to remain active and have a better quality of life," Mr Redman said.

Administered by the Department of Sport and Recreation, the four-year scheme will provide \$1 million to metropolitan clubs and \$1 million to regional clubs.

This round closes on October 16 this year, with another scheduled to open in March 2016.

Mr Waldron said this week the State Government was also celebrating a sporting milestone, having supported 50,000 Western Australian children to play sport through the KidSport program






