The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 21st May 2015 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council completed reviews of a number of internal documents at the April meeting. These included the Strategic Community Plan, Asbestos Management Plan, the Ten Year Plant Replacement Program, Functional Road Hierarchy Review, and the Five Year Road Construction Program. These documents, in conjunction with various Asset Management Plans, the Long Term Financial Plan, Corporate Business Plan and the Workforce Plan, provide Council with the information required to effectively plan for the long term sustainability of our Shire.

Council also considered and approved a request for a financial contribution to the Department of Sport and Recreation Great Southern, to assist with the development of a Regional Sport and Recreation Facilities Plan.

DID YOU KNOW.....

That Council has supported a number of community events and projects held recently, both financially and with in-kind assistance? These included the Tambellup Show, the Maggie Dent seminar in Broomehill, the St John Ambulance fundraiser in Tambellup, the Broomehill and Tambellup Anzac Services, and the development of the nature playground on Crawford St in Tambellup. It is wonderful to note that each of these events received fantastic support from the community, and equally as pleasing, is that each event was driven by members of your local community.

The Strategic Community Plan workshops in 2012 highlighted the community's desire for enhanced entertainment and recreation options. There is no shortage of ideas for potential events and new facilities, however it is the drive from the community that is required to initiate projects.

Do you have a glimmer of an idea for a new community event? Why not get a group of like-minded people on board, flesh your idea out and then contact the Shire to see what assistance may be available to you. While direct financial requests are not always able to be accommodated, Council is able to consider other forms of in kind assistance. Again, please contact Pam at the Shire for more information.

COUNCIL WORKS

The construction crew had a number of projects underway during April. Sealing to a section of Tambellup West Road at the town boundary is nearing completion and works on Nardlah Rd to resheet a 4.6km section, install a new culvert and seal a section are ongoing.

The maintenance graders have been working in the north west part of the Shire and around the Broomehill townsite area, and will be moving to assist with construction projects in coming weeks.

The maintenance crew has been working on a wide range of jobs including signage, drainage and culvert cleaning with the backhoe. Culvert widening on Broomehill Kojonup Road has been delayed due to rain

In the lead up to Anzac Day, the parks and gardens crew were busy getting the memorial areas and town centres weed free and tidy. Maintenance of the reticulation systems in the townsites is still a key area of activity, with water levels in Council's dams being closely monitored. The ovals have been vertimowed and fertilised in accordance with recommendations from industry advisers, and are looking a picture at the moment.

Upcoming works include the widening and resheeting of a 9km section of Pindellup Rd, and the construction of a taper at the intersection of Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd and Great Southern Hwy, to assist roadtrains turning left onto the highway. The Jetpatcher will be carrying out a maintenance run on the Shire's bitumen road network in coming weeks. The Tambellup West Road drainage has been installed and the section has been graded ready for sealing and the installation of new kerbing.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN REVIEW

In accordance with legislation, Council is required to undertake a minor review of the *Strategic Community Plan 2012-2022* which was developed with community input through surveys and workshops in 2012.

The review was completed and the reviewed document endorsed at the April Council meeting. Copies of the document are available at the Council offices and the Tambellup Community Resource Centre for perusal.

Overall, no changes were made to the strategies included in the Plan, however Council determined to consult further with the community on a number of initiatives which were considered to be a priority when the Plan was developed.

These were:

- To favourably consider an approach from the community to establish community gardens in the Shire
- To favourably consider an approach from the community to participation in the annual Clean up Australia Day initiative
- To favourably consider an approach from the community to support the establishment of Men's Sheds within the Shire.

Initiatives such as these have been extremely successful in other communities and increase community capacity and amenity, however they are more likely to succeed if driven by the community rather than Council. If any community group has been considering projects along these lines, we would invite you to contact Pam Hull at the Shire to discuss how Council may be able to assist.

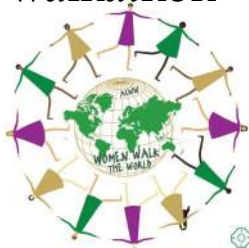

SMOKE ALARM**CHANGING YOUR SMOKE ALARM BATTERY**

FACTSHEET

02**ONLY WORKING SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES**

Whether you need to change your smoke alarm battery will depend on the type of smoke alarm you have.

IS IT TIME TO CHANGE YOUR BATTERY?

Smoke alarms powered by 9V ALKALINE BATTERY require you to replace the battery every year. DFES recommends you change your battery on April 1st.

Smoke alarms powered by a 10 YEAR NON-REMOVABLE LITHIUM BATTERY do not require you to change the battery each year. Do not try to remove these batteries.

MAINS POWERED (HARD WIRED) SMOKE ALARMS are powered by an external power source. These alarms also have a battery back-up for periods of mains power outage. Many models have a rechargeable (non-removable) battery and do not need replacement. Refer to the manufacturer's instructions to see if you need to change the battery. Where you need to change the battery, DFES recommends you do this on April 1st.

YOU SHOULD KNOW...

- ☐ Smoke alarms will make a 'beep' or 'chirping' sound when they have a low battery or are faulty.
- ☐ Mains powered smoke alarms may also make this low battery warning after periods of extended mains power outage. If this happens and your smoke alarm has a replaceable battery, you will need to change your battery.
- ☐ Not all smoke alarms need their battery replaced. Smoke alarms with a non-replaceable battery may have a warning that the battery is not replaceable. Always check the manufacturer's instructions before replacing the battery.
- ☐ Mains powered smoke alarms are required to have a green "Power ON" LED indicator. This will light up when the alarm is connected to mains power.
- ☐ All smoke Alarms also have a red light that flashes momentarily every 40-60 seconds to visually indicate they are operating. This same red light flashes continuously when the Smoke Alarm has been activated. If there are interconnected smoke alarms the fast flashing red light will indicate which smoke alarm initiated the alarm.
- ☐ Always test that your smoke alarm is operating after replacing the battery by holding down the test button until you hear a loud alert tone. All smoke alarms require regular maintenance. Refer to Fact sheet 4 – Smoke Alarm Maintenance for further information.
- ☐ All smoke alarms require replacement every 10 years.

**IN THE EVENT OF A FIRE**

- ☐ Crawl low under smoke.
- ☐ Assist or alert any people in danger, but only if it is safe to do so.
- ☐ Go to your safe meeting place, such as your letter box.
- ☐ Call **000** (triple zero).
- ☐ Wait for firefighters to arrive.
- ☐ Do not re-enter a burning house under any circumstances.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Watson, James – Later known as Jim the Pigman. Shepherd for WHG in 1864 and 1865 – possibly later. He shepherded his sheep at Perringillup, Nabrunup, Wardlewairup and Ewlyamartup. His rations were taken to him by WHG, Bobbinet or Queetchal. On 8th November 1864, "Tom" was sent to him with rations and to be his hut keeper but he managed to get lost in the bush for a while. On 6th May 1883, Harry Adams reported that Jim the Pigman had not been seen for six days. Jim's remains were found by 12th May; he had been killed, cut up, and burnt and Bob Hagar (?) and his mate were taken for murder. However on 23rd May Cpl Heaton and PC Cole were looking for more of his remains. Hagar got away from the police at Kojonup but was apprehended by PC Cole on 19th July – on the other side of Esperance Bay.

Watts – On 22nd October 1895, two of TN's daughters drove into Broomehill to bring Mr Watts out to tune the piano.

Wells, John – Gypsy Jack. Shepherd for TN in 1888. On 27th October, after shearing, Jack took his flock to Wackenup-947. He came into Sunnyside in November to have his flock drafted and TN started with him on 11th November with 905 tags and 10 culls for the Gordon, travelling via Killibinup and Watagarup reaching the camp at midday on 13th November. The next day TN pitched a tent and made a yard for the sheep. By the end of December the flock had been shifted to Pootenup. When TN counts Wells' flock on 1st January 1889, there were only 622 out of the 915

and some had been bitten by dogs. 756 sheep were accounted for by the 7th January. On 15th January 1889, Wells' flock was made up to 1115 and given over to Dave Thorley.

White – On 22nd August 1892, Old White the Shoemaker was at Goblup.

White, George - On 16th May 1863, George White the Sawyer was at Nannamillup and he is referred to fairly regularly by WHG until late 1864 but it is possible that he lived at Eticup. He was at Nannamillup on 15th September 1863 with Bob Clay, Hiscock, Chester and Black Harry and "all were pretty well screwed". He came to Nannamillup for his rations or called for no given reason so probably for companionship. On 26th November 1863 George the Sawyer and WHG went to look for a peach tree (quongdong) as the one felled the previous day was no good, and the sheoak had been bad, but they could not find any. On 23rd January 1864 George White was threshing out a little wheat. He was back on 5th February and next day was sawing up a white gum for cart stuff and on 9th with WHG felled a yate tree for a pair of cart shafts. On 21st March 1864, George White finished his sawing and left for the sound two days later. He was back from Albany on 7th April and on the 11th WHG sent a load of barley to Eticup for George White to crack. On 28th May 1864 he brought the auger back from Warkelup and on 25th June WHG sent letters to George White to take to Kojonup. On 19th August George came in to trim shingles and WHG settled with him two days later. Unfortunately and confusingly there were two other men named George working for WHG at this time – George Hobbs and someone referred to simply as "George" but usually WHG used George White's full name when writing about him.

White, J - Member of the Goblup shearing team in 1890 and on 10th December TN gave money to Sam Baggs to pay J White for shearing.

Snippets of Tambellup's History

Tambellup Golf Club

"The first Golf Course was situated in one of Mr Owen Saggars' paddocks adjacent to the Boat House on the Gordon River.

It was about 1933 when it was decided the town should have a course of its own, so 90 acres of land were purchased from Rourke's at 30 shillings per acre. Money was borrowed from the Bank of New South Wales with Guarantors AT Birt, G Hodby and MC Abernethy, to enable them to clear the first 9 fairways and build a small clubhouse, which is still part of the existing building.

After the fairways were cleared, Mr Chas Bessen and Mr Merv Abernethy went in with their teams of horses and ploughed, harrowed, raked and rolled the fairways. This took about one week, during which they camped on Mr Dick Diprose's property.

It is thought that Mr Roy Hammer planted the pine trees and Mr Bert Mason and Cliff Marsh put in the bunkers using a spade. Much credit is due over this period at working bees to Members who turned up in force all day and had their lunch on course.

About 1935 a further three holes were prepared, making a 12 hole course. Later, a further three holes were prepared ready to play on in the 1940 season. But the 1939 Carnival was played on a 15 hole course.

In more recent years there have been several changes to the course, to increase the overall distance of the course.

Further improvements have been made including three major Clubhouse extensions, SEC Power and connections to the Town Water Supply, also rabbit netting at the course.

The Tambellup Golf Club now enjoys a membership of over 100 Members and Associates."

- A bank account was opened with the Bank of New South Wales on 13th March 1928. Secretary was DG Harvey, Treasurer was AJ Smith and President was Owen Saggars
- 1930/32 – Afternoon tea was served in the Boathouse and provided by the Missus Bishops for 9 pence per person.
- 1939 - 15 holes, SSS – 71. 5688 yards.
- Green fees – 1 shilling for 18 holes.

Waldron strongly supports upgrades to vital health services at five local communities

"These improved services and facilities will also assist to attract and retain hospital staff, which will help narrow the divide between regional and metropolitan health services," Mr Waldron said.

Mr Waldron said contracts had been awarded to BGC Constructions Pty Ltd for Gnowangerup; CPD Group Pty Ltd for Tambellup and Lake Grace; Smith Constructions Bunbury for Kojonup and Perkins Builders for Wagin.

The SIHI project has delivered an array of health improvements since it began in 2011, including the award-winning Emergency Telehealth Service (ETS), the introduction of 24/7 rosters at key regional emergency departments, and a range of priority primary health initiatives.

The \$565million SIHI will deliver health upgrades in 37 towns. And the \$108.8million Small Hospital and Nursing Post Refurbishment Program will upgrade up to 26 facilities.
