DID YOU KNOW.....?

That it is prohibited to exercise dogs on either of the town ovals?

Council's parks and gardens staff, and sporting groups have reported the amount of dog poo on the ovals in Broomehill and Tambellup is steadily increasing again.

Residents are reminded that in accordance with the **Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Dogs Local Law 2008** dogs are **prohibited absolutely** from the Broomehill Recreational Complex and the Tambellup Sports Ground.

Contravention of this Local law may see a fine of up to \$2000 imposed on the person in control of the dog at the time of the offence.

The Local Law also states that it is an offence for a dog to excrete in a public place and a fine of \$200 may be imposed on the person/s in control of the dog if they fail to remove the excrement.

Council has set aside designated dog exercise areas in both townsites for off leash exercising of dogs. These areas are located at:

- Reserve 634 Javelin St Broomehill
- Reserve 1698 Spencer Rd Broomehill
- Lot 24 Broomehill-Kojonup Rd Broomehill
- Part of Reserve 19757 East Terrace Tambellup (not including the oval and immediate surrounds)
- Reserve 22607 Garrity St Tambellup.

Your cooperation in this regard will be sincerely appreciated by users of the ovals.

ANNUAL ELECTORS MEETING

The Annual Electors meeting held on the 1th February saw a small turnout of interested electors. Matters discussed included the condition of gravel roads in the Shire, the condition of the Tambellup Sports oval and the status of the proposal to redevelop the Pavilion, managing requests for assistance by DFES at major emergency incidents in the state, and Total Fire Bans. Thank you to those who attended.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

At the December Ordinary meeting, Council considered the report provided by the Auditors following the annual audit process. The report provides an independent review of the management of Council's financial systems, and no issues of concern were highlighted.

Council adopted the 2013-2014 Annual Report, and set the date for the Annual Electors meeting, which was held on 10th February 2015. The Annual Report is available on Council's website – http://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/shire/publications.php
Council determined not to support a request by the Broomehill Primary School for an additional financial contribution to assist with bus hire for swimming lessons.

At the February meeting, Council completed the half yearly review of the annual budget. All projects are tracking well to date, and no major amendments to the budget were required.

Council determined that a review of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup's Local Laws will be undertaken collaboratively with Southern Link VROC partners the Shires of Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet.

Council endorsed a new Strategic Plan for the Southern Link VROC, of which it is a member Council. The Strategic Plan provides a framework to commence collaborative implementation planning (who, when, what resources, what cost) within the four VROC member Councils.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS/ROAD CLOSURES

COUNCIL WORKS

Council's gardening crew has been busy over the summer months maintaining water supplies to parks, gardens and the ovals, and hand watering where required. The ovals have been fertilised, and sprayed for black beetle and lawn grubs. With a lack of summer storms this season the water situation for parks and gardens is becoming challenging. In Broomehill the Complex Dam is empty and the Town dam is receding quickly with the hot weather. The CBH dam is empty as the water has been used by the CBH for construction projects. In Tambellup, the treated waste water has nearly been exhausted for the summer as the Water Corporation requires a certain level of water to remain in the ponds. The other dams are down to around 50% capacity. All reticulation systems have been checked to ensure they are working correctly to make best use of the water available.

The construction crew has been working across the shire repairing roads which broke up during harvest. Work has also continued to repair Etna Rd, and while it is open to all traffic, sections are still quite damp. We appreciate residents' feedback as to the condition of the roads, and ask for your patience as the graders work to address the issues. In the meantime, please consider the condition of the roads you are travelling on, and drive according to the conditions.

Resealing was completed recently on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd and Greenhills North Rd, and works have commenced to widen and seal a stretch of Tambellup West Road starting at the town boundary.

Best wishes are extended to Colleen Brown on her 'retirement' from the Tambellup CRC. The CRC delivers library services to the community on Council's behalf, and Colleen has been the face of the library for many years, providing a warm and friendly service for library and CRC patrons. 
of the Tambellup Art Group will be held at the Tambellup CRC on Tuesday 10th March at 7pm.





TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT – UPDATE FEBRUARY 2015

The redevelopment project is in a holding pattern at the moment, pending the outcomes of a number of funding applications.

The committee which has been established to drive the project has met on a number of occasions, with early designs being taken back to clubs and groups for comment. While the feedback indicated many changes and requests are required by the clubs, it is important to remember the plans distributed are only a draft document, and that the final design will be determined through consultation with the community.

David Heaver from H & H Architects met with Council and the committee last year to discuss the feedback received from the clubs and groups, and advised that it was possible to include all amendments and requests in a final design, however the limiting factor would be the amount of funding available for the project. With that in mind, all stakeholders need to be aware that there will need to be compromise all round so we are able to achieve the best possible outcome with the available budget.

A huge amount of work has gone into preparing three funding applications, to the **Department of Sport and Recreation CSRFF** program (\$975,000), the federally funded **National Stronger Regions Fund** (NSRF) (\$1.5M) and the **Great Southern Development Commission (GSDC) Regional Grants Scheme** (\$300,000).

We are anticipating an outcome to the **DSR** application at any time now. The reason for the delay has been put down to the change in Minister for Sport and Recreation delaying the decision process. This state wide funding program is traditionally way oversubscribed, with an independent committee making recommendations to the Minister for sign off.

The **NSRF** is a pool of \$1 billion over five years to fund priority infrastructure in local communities. The program objectives are based around economic development - improved levels of economic activity, productivity, employment, a more skilled workforce, increased capacity and capability to deliver major projects and to secure and manage investment funding, improved partnerships between local state and territory governments, the private sector and community groups, and more stable and viable communities where people choose to live.

Of course we think our project addresses all of that, and we hope we found the words to convey that in the application! The fund will be extremely competitive being a nationwide program, but we are hopeful. Announcements will be made early in May, and at the same time the second round of funding will be announced. So there's another opportunity if we dip out this round.

The **GDSC Regional Grants Scheme** is a pool of \$1 million funded by Royalties for Regions, and community groups and local governments in the Great Southern region are eligible to submit project applications. We have requested \$300,000, and we anticipate an outcome by the end of the financial year. It is possible that any funding allocated will be for a reduced amount so the pool can be spread as widely over the region as possible.

The outcome of these applications will determine Council's direction for funding the remainder of the project.

Until the final budget has been determined, there is not much to be done. Council is keen for a Management Committee to be established comprising representatives of user groups, interested community members and Council representation. The committee will be responsible for the ongoing management of the new facility, along the lines of how the Cranbrook, Broomehill and Gnowangerup facilities are managed.

It goes without saying that the management of the new facility will need to have a business like structure with definite business planning and procedures developed. If anyone in the community is particularly interested in being involved in this process, we invite you to contact either Joanne Trezona or Pam Hull at the Shire.

Further information on the progress of the redevelopment proposal will be advised to the community as it becomes available.

Waldron pleased with strong support for local crime prevention projects

Local Nationals WA MP Terry Waldron MLA has welcomed three grants in the Wagin electorate, awarded to grassroots community crime prevention initiatives.

Almost \$680,000 in crime prevention grants was announced this week for 33 community organisations and local governments undertaking projects to assist in deterring and preventing crime.

Twenty-three of the Community Crime Prevention Fund projects are based in the regions, including nine CCTV initiatives that received a combined total of almost \$200,000 in grants to target crime hotspots and facilitate the prosecution of criminals

Mr Waldron said community-based organisations played an important role, providing educational resources and implementing strategies to aid crime prevention

"Many of these organisations place particular emphasis on prevention and early intervention to address the needs of children and families who might be involved with or affected by crime, as well as youth justice and ways of reducing re-offending," he said.

"Where applicable they often work closely with local police and other welfare agencies to achieve a common goal of making our communities safer and more pleasant places to live."

- Projects in the Wagin electorate to receive funding include –

 Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup for the Gnowangerup-Tambellup Kids Sports Program (\$5247); Shire of Kulin for the Camp Kulin Strive Program (\$20,240); and

 - Shire of Pingelly for the Pingelly 2014 CCTV Expansion project (\$20,065).

Addressing and reducing drug and alcohol-related crime and preventing and responding to antisocial behaviour are also focuses of many crime prevention projects.

Mr Waldron said a whole-of-community effort was important to curb crime locally.

"I encourage residents in the Wagin electorate to get involved with these projects as they are important in allowing communities to tackle various crime-related issues," he said.

"The Community Crime Prevention Fund supports this, but encouraging ethical and law abiding behaviour in all walks of life is everyone's responsibility.

- Regional and strategic waste management approach (Shire of Jerramungup) \$3,112,240 for the construction of waste management facilities in the Shires of Ravensthorpe, Jerramungup, Gnowangerup, Kent and Katanning.
- Boddington Recreation and Community Centre Stage 1 (Shire of Boddington) \$2,500,000 for the construction of an indoor multipurpose sporting facility in Boddington.
- Narrogin Heavy Haulage Bypass Wanerie Road Extension (Shire of Narrogin) \$1,039,445 for the completion of the road extension between the Wanerie Road Extension and the Great Southern Highway, in Narrogin.

A total of fourteen projects were given the green light, as part of this funding round.

It will take four years to implement all 85 sites. This new project starts this year and will be completed by 2018.

According to Mr Waldron, the RTP builds on the "success of the \$40million Regional Mobile Communications Project (RMCP)

"The RMCP, which was a joint project between the State Government and Telstra, was completed in September last year after 113 new and upgraded telecommunications towers were installed across regional and remote parts of WA," Mr Waldron said.

"The new RTP telecommunications initiative is another big step in the right direction."

Aldridge urges Abbott to fast-track childcare plan

Member for the Agricultural Region, Hon Martin Aldridge MLC has urged Prime Minister Tony Abbott and the Federal Government to move swiftly to introduce a new plan to bolster

Mr Aldridge's comments follow the Prime Minister's address to the National Press Club on Monday, in which the PM abandoned his flagship Paid Parental Leave Scheme in favour of more affordable and available child care.

The Nationals MP welcomed the Prime Minister's change in direction, however stressed the need for the Federal Government to 'get moving'.

"The Prime Minister signalled his intention to consult widely on a new childcare platform, without actually committing to some action," Mr Aldridge said

"I suggest the bulk of that consultation has already been undertaken through the Productivity Commission's report due to be tabled in Parliament at the end of March."

The Productivity Commission's Childcare and Early Childhood Learning Issues Paper was ased on 5 December 2013, and a draft of the final report was released in July last year

The Commission's final report is expected to be comprehensive, having received over 900 submissions during its public consultation process.

Mr Aldridge emphasised the need for the Federal Government to fast-track its plans to improve childcare availability and affordability, particularly in regional area

"There are vast gaps across the Agricultural Region in which no or limited childcare services are available," Mr Aldridge said.

"Many childcare centres in the Agricultural Region continue to struggle as a result of the inflexible National Quality Framework introduced under Labor."

"The regulatory system for childcare must recognise the unique challenges faced in regional

"Whilst important to maintain high standards in early childhood education, we must recognise that regulating small regional childcare centres out of business would result in a worse outcome for both children and parents," Mr Aldridge said.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Warburton, Randle – On 14th April 1886, TN wrote that Randle Warburton was in charge at Goblup and that Mr Lott was shifting his things as Lady Campbell had taken the sheep from him. On 9th July 1886, Randle called at Sunnyside to borrow half a bottle of brandy for Mrs Trimmer who was ill at Goblup, and on 17th August he joined TN's kangaroo shooting party, staying out overnight. After hunting lost sheep at Pootenup early in September he called at Sunnyside on 3rd and complained to TN that Lady Campbell had not treated him right in taking him so short and discharging him without cause. Two days later he was at Pootenup counting sheep over to George Dunne – his replacement. Later still that month, TN let him have Nobby to look for his own pony. On 13th September 2888, Randle, his wife and Mrs Hammersley (Blanche Trimmer) passed Sunnyside on their way to Albany.

Warburton, Robin (?) – At Goblup on 4th October 1881 with Fred White who had come to visit his sister.

Warburton, Roland – On 19th September 1888, Roland Warburton and a plain clothes policeman called at Sunnyside. They had come from Albany by train and walked from the siding – about 6kms.

Warburton families became known as Egerton-Warburton. **Ward, Charles** – First mention by TN on 2nd February 1886 so was probably working at Sunnyside in 1885. In January/ February 1886 he helped TN at the fire at Deep Creek, went with Finefellow around the fire at McGuire's and to help with fire near Fairfield, and started with tags for O'Brien's flock. He also went with two natives to Chillicup to collect 80 jam stakes. In March and April he shod horses, collected more jam posts, started for Albany with sandalwood and 50 kangaroo skins, took wheat to Fairfield to crack, and helped TN cut timber for wool press, gates and posts. On 7th May he started with TN and the team to take 64 bushels of barley to the Mount Barker Police (TN stayed in the Pootenup area and Ward and Finefellow completed the trip to Mount Barker). He apparently went to Albany as he returned to Sunnyside on 16th May on 'Robin". On 24th May 1886, Charlie took Jack Ferris, Finefellow, Johnny Moorhen and two native women to Kain's lambing station, the women to mind lambs. When he got back on the 28th, he told TN that Kain and Ferris were drunk when he left. (TN summonsed the two men and Charlie Ward and Finefellow attended the Kojonup Court in July as witnesses.). Later in 1886 Ward's duties included mortising posts for the wool press and, with others, helping with the sheep at the Sheep Wash. On Christmas Day, he and Thomas Chester were the only two men at the Christmas dinner. Ward was still working for TN in 1887 but details are not available except that on one occasion he accompanied Joseph Louther to Pootenup to collect salt. In 1888 after TN had established his arrangements with the railway men, Charlie Ward and TN's son George, made most of the trips along the line to take provisions to the navvies. Also during that year his work as a general servant and teamster included carting forage from Toovey's for the railway; taking a load of stores from the gravel pits to Townsend's; ploughing, sowing and harrowing a paddock ready for green corn; and helping at the Sheep Wash. TN's last (available) entry regarding Charlie Ward was made on 19th January 1889 when he went to get

sandalwood for Van Zuilecom.

Snippets of Tambellup's History

Early Medicine

Prior to a hospital being built in Tambellup, the sick were attended to by a nurse in their own homes. District Nurse Kathie Trathan carried out these duties from 1903 to 1912. It was then that a Mr Weston built a cottage-style hospital on the corner of Lovegrove Street and North Terrace. From there, Nurse Turner assisted Dr Frederic Lovegrove, caring for the sick and delivering pioneer babies. When Dr Lovegrove went to war, Nurse Turner was made District Nurse and remained in Tambellup until 1933.



1922 saw the beginning of plans for an "Isolation Ward" and fund raising for the project began. By 1924 a basic plan had been prepared, the building to be erected on 5 acres at the corner of **Saggers Road** and **North Terrace**, at a cost of £400. Plans included 2 wards, each accommodating 2 adults or 3 children, a nurses room, kitchen, vestibule and a verandah all around.


£200 had already been raised locally as follows:

The chosen site was then deemed too low-lying and an application then secured another 5 acres west of the railway and north of the bridge. A tender by **Proctor & Morris** was accepted in September, 1925, and the building was completed by December that year. The total cost being:

The Government contributed £470.15. 0 and the committee arranged an overdraft of £200 with the **Primary Producers Bank**. The hospital was officially opened on **23rd June**, **1926**.


