





Whats the difference between a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban and a Total Fire Ban

A Total Fire Ban (TFB) is declared by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services on days when fires would be likely to threaten lives and property if they were to occur, or if there are a number of large fires across the State and resources are stretched.

It's important to know what you can and can't do on these days.

When a TFB is declared it is prohibited to light any fires in the open air, or to perform any activity that may start a fire.

Agricultural activities can continue during a Total Fire Ban, as long as a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban has not been implemented by your local government.

Though if the activity is not of an urgent nature and can be put off for another day it's recommended that this be done.

Activities such as grinding, welding or operating an oxytorch (Hot works) are not permitted during a TFB.

The Shire will distribute an SMS to those on the Harvest Ban SMS System to notify you when a HVMB has been implemented by the shire or when a Total Fire Ban has been declared by DFES for the Region.

Videos a Noongar pathway to NRM

South Coast NRM has extended its commitment to the Noongar community by producing a series of short career pathway films, which it hopes will inspire Aboriginal youth to consider a profession in natural resource management (NRM).

The eight videos feature informal interviews with a diversity of personalities working in the NRM sector and range from a young man with aspirations to be a botanist, to a young woman embarking on a government traineeship.

The interviewees openly discuss their backgrounds, why they love working in natural resource management, the role models who have had significant impacts on their lives and what career aspirations they have for the future.

Local Noongar educator and consultant Larry Blight, who was one of the project's interviewees, said the videos will provide a great chance to inspire and encourage the next generation of Noongar youth into working on country.

South Coast NRM Cultural Connections project officer Chris Spurr who managed the project, said using video to encourage and promote environmental employment to young Aboriginals was an exciting development and a first for the region.

"Through my experience, youth respond positively to video, so I'm optimistic these films will provide effective engagement for young local Aboriginals," Chris said.

"Many young Noongars have probably never considered, or are even aware a career in natural resource management could exist for them, so for them to view their peers enjoying a successful vocation in the industry will hopefully be encouraging, uplifting and inspiring.

"For effective landscape protection, restoration and rehabilitation, engaging Aboriginal people through practical activities on country could lead to many successful outcomes, as community members are also able to fulfil their cultural responsibilities, meet social and economic needs and transfer knowledge across generations."

Initially the videos will be distributed to the Noongar and wider community at the rate of one per week through www.southcoastnrm.com.au and the South Coast NRM Facebook page. They will also be used for South Coast NRM promotional events and school career forums.

New Chair and Deputy Chair for Regional Development Australia Great Southern WA

The Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development the Hon Warren Truss MP, this week announced RDA Chair and Deputy Chair appointments in several states including Western Australia. Local business identity and Deputy Mayor of the City of Albany Mr Greg Stocks has been appointed as the new Chair for the RDA Great Southern WA Committee with Ms Liz Guidera from the Katanning community appointed as the new Deputy Chair.

Mr Stocks said he was excited at the opportunity to work with the local RDA and looks forward to continuing engagement with a broad range of stakeholders on RDA's economic agenda for the region.

"RDA Great Southern has made a significant contribution to the region including a facilitation role for delivering over \$17 million of Commonwealth funding for priority infrastructure projects including the Centennial Park redevelopment project in Albany and other important projects in our regional towns" he said.

Mr Stocks said there was a renewed focus for Regional Development Australia Committees to drive economic growth and make the most of the potential capability of their regions. He paid tribute to outgoing Chair Mr Milton Evans and Deputy Chair Ms Sue Bennett-Ng, who along with the RDA Committee had made a great contribution over the last five years in establishing the RDA and ensuring the organisation was directly involved in major strategic planning for the Great Southern.

Mr Stocks' first challenge will be to oversee the selection of a new RDA Committee in the coming weeks with new members jointly appointed by the Chair and Deputy Chair in consultation with the Minister. Mr Stocks said he would be seeking people with skills and experience from across the region representative of the diverse communities and economy of the region. "One of the strengths of the RDA Committee has been the bringing together of committed people who understand their own backyard and who are able to achieve good outcomes which best serve the whole region".

The RDA Committee will also assist local community stakeholders to develop project proposals and direct them to appropriate public and/or private funding sources – including the \$1 billion National Stronger Regions Fund.

Innovation the key to long-term water security in upper Great Southern

The upper Great Southern and a large extent of the Wagin electorate are the main focus of a new water blueprint launched recently, designed to meet a forecast 75 per cent growth in water use throughout the region over the next 30 years.

The Great Southern water supply strategy, announced by Water Minister Mia Davies MLA, brings together region-wide planning initiatives dating back to 2008, conducted by the Department of Water, Water Corporation and Great Southern Water Reference Group.

It includes three key strategic directions focusing on more wastewater recycling, increased stormwater harvesting and sustainable groundwater sourcing.

Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA said the strategy would guide water security for scheme, agricultural and industrial supply to 2030 and beyond.

"This strategy outlines a plethora of options and considerations to help ensure adequate water supplies in coming decades, as demand increases," Mr Waldron said.

"This includes securing supply for the Great Southern towns water supply scheme, which feeds Broomehill, Tambellup, Gnowangerup, Katanning, Nyabing, Pingrup, Kojonup, Woodanilling and Muradup."

Mr Waldron said the strategy identified building alternative water supplies for community use and farming towns such as Cranbrook, Frankland, Borden, Ongerup, Jerramungup, Rocky Gully and Wellstead that rely on potable water supplies from small local dams.

"This will create more water for non-drinking purposes and save drinking water for scheme demand," he said.

"Good progress has already been made in this area, with Royalties for Regions funding utilised for wastewater harvesting and reuse projects in the shires of Broomehill-Tambellup, Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet."

Additionally, the Department of Water has provided grant subsidies of more than \$800,000 to the region's farmers to conduct water audits and improve alternative water supplies on their farms. The Department's Community Water Supply Program has also provided funding for emergency water supplies.

These include stormwater harvesting and storage in Woodanilling, a 10,000kL dam at Jacup, in the Shire of Jerramungup, re-use of a previously disused dam at Wagin, new storage tanks and swipe card facilities in Kulin and a system to access treated wastewater for irrigating sporting grounds, in the Shire of Kent.

Mr Waldron said the strategy promoted other innovation such as the desalination of hypersaline groundwater for farming - which is already being planned for in Wagin - and groundwater investigations to supply proposed mining ventures near Katanning.

Waldron welcomes eight NRM grants for Wagin electorate

Protecting and maintaining natural resources is vital to the agricultural industry, and to enhancing the wellbeing of country residents, according to Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA.

Mr Waldron today welcomed eight State Natural Resource Management (NRM) Program community grants (2014-15) for the Wagin electorate.

The local grant recipients include – the Katanning LCDC (three projects), the Wagin Woodanilling Landcare Zone (two projects), the Shire of Kent, Wandering Primary School and the Dumbleyung Landcare Zone.

Protecting remnant vegetation, fencing and revegetation works, bridal creeper control programs, a Carnaby's black cockatoo initiative and conservation and biodiversity work are some of the diverse projects to be undertaken by the successful local proponents.

Mr Waldron said the NRM and similar initiatives were important to agricultural practices and the preservation of natural resources.

"I am supportive of the NRM program as it's initiatives like these that are protecting the livelihoods of local farmers and simultaneously enhancing the wellbeing of residents in rural areas by providing safe places for family outings or for children to play outdoors."

A total of 98 WA proponents were successful in this round of the program, sharing in total funding of \$2.7million.

Agriculture and Food Minister Ken Baston said the recently-announced projects would conserve and restore unique eco-systems throughout the State.

"Without these grants important environmental work would often not occur, especially in remote regions," Mr Baston said.

"In addition to Government funding, project groups will contribute more than \$5million in their own funds and effort," he said.

Since October 2010, the State Government has made funds available annually, targeting onground community action to encourage continued involvement of generous West Australians prepared to volunteer to enhance and maintain our natural resources.

This funding has helped more than 220 community groups and organisations, industry groups, local governments, schools and State Government agencies.

Waldron encourages proponents to apply for women's interest grants

With the Shire of Kulin's leadership retreat at Camp Kulin a previous recipient of Grants for Women funding, Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA is encouraging local proponents to apply for the initiative's latest round.

Mr Waldron said Western Australia's community organisations and local governments were invited to apply for up to \$5000 for projects supporting women's economic independence and leadership.

He said funding was now available under the State Government program for WA-based projects.

"These are fantastic grants. They are making a difference," Mr Waldron said.

"One example is the Camp Kulin leadership retreat which enabled participating women to develop leadership and communication skills, and to build self-confidence."

Other previously funded projects include Yorgas Going Forward, a one-day forum run by the Armadale Noongar Corporation and featuring advice and presentations from Aboriginal businesswomen.

"This Government is committed to breaking down the barriers women continue to face in terms of leadership and financial independence," he said.

"I encourage any group or organisation to apply for the Grants for Women program, which enables organisations to develop tailored solutions to the unique challenges faced by women in their communities."

The State Government is delivering a number of initiatives to improve the status of women in WA. This includes the Being Board Ready Guide encouraging women into leadership roles, scholarships for women to participate in mentoring and entrepreneurial development programs and increased support to Women in Technology WA.

<u>Broomehill Historical</u> <u>Notes</u>

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Vice Regal - On 17th December 1883, TN went to the Court House at Albany to hear the address read to the Governor. Sir Frederick Napier Broome, by Mr Knight and to the banquet at 1 o'clock. Over 40 men sat down to the table. In October 1886 TN received an invitation to attend the Turning the First Sod at Albany by Governor Broome for the start of the north-bound section of the Great Southern Railway - he did not go. On 19th October 1892, the Governor, Sir William Robinson, attended the second Broome Hill Agricultural Show and banquet. TN attended the banquet but not the concert and Grand Ball at night. The Governor also left after the banquet and J.F.T. Hassell took him out to see Lord Brassey's Goblup Estate. A newspaper item, lamenting the loss of good agricultural land, said he would only have seen fences and sheep. On 14th and 15th October 1895, the governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, accompanied by Lady Brassey, visited his Goblup Estate, and on 22nd December that year, TN was asked to read a short address to the Governor, Sir Gerard Smith, and Lady Smith, at the Railway Station. The Governor was passing through Perth by train. Wade, Miss - Brought to Goblup by the Rev Withers on 27th September 1880 to be teacher for the children. She is mentioned several times when accompanying the family on outings - including church services at Fairfield. Her brother Fred came to visit her on 4th October 1881 and on 7th December that year TN left Goblup to take her and his daughters, Hannah and Nora, to Albany via Josiah Norrish's at Tambellarup AND Mount Barker, apparently her time with the Norrish family over.

Wagstaff, Jack – Arrived at Goblup on 25th September 1883 to shear.

Wallace, Robert – Working at Sunnyside in 1886 – possibly since 1885. On 17th February 1886, while working with TN shifting the body off one wagon to put on another, a lever flew out of Bob's hand and hit TN on the side of his hat, leaving a 2" wound on the side of TN's head without cutting the hat. In March he was carting earth from a tank being dug and helping TN make a hut for Chester at Cox's camp. On 15th April TN settled with him, paying £2.16.0 but refers to his being at work on 19th and deciding to let him go. TN discharged him on 20th April 1886.

Walton, Thomas – Tom Walton called at Goblup on 23rd September 1881.

Warburton, Augustus – Gus Warburton came to Goblup in the evening of 5th November 1883 and next accompanied TN, Joseph Spencer and Mr Knight to Boylup to see improvements there. On 5th September 1888 he brought some cattle that he had sold to Climie to put in TN's paddock at Sunnyside.

Warburton, Horace – TN saw Horace Warburton and Lady Campbell at Pootenup on 25th February 1886 while they were baiting their horses there. (To bait was to take a break in a journey – to tend to horses and humans).




