No meeting is held in January.

Council considered the draft Bushfire - Prone Vegetation Mapping as provided by the Office of Bushfire Risk Management for comment. Council will request further information and clarification on the bushfire risk management framework and how it affects local government and the implications and potential imposts it will have on the community.

Council granted approval to Formosa Flora to collect native seed from Council managed reserves and road reserves within the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup subject to conditions.

Following the close of the advertising period, Council formally agreed to change the name of the portion of Norrish Road Broomehill, between Great Southern Highway and the Tieline Road intersection, to Tieline Road. The proposal is to be forwarded to the Geographic Names Committee for its consideration and approval.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

The Shire Offices will close at **12 noon** on **Wednesday 24 December 2014** and reopen again at 8.30am on **Monday 5 January 2015**. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers
Licensing services available at either office during that period.

Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Friday 19 December 2014. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas period.

Rubbish and recycling collections will be carried out as normal over the Christmas/New Year period. The weekly rubbish collection will be carried out on **Thursday 25 December** and **Thursday 1 January.** The fortnightly recycling collection will be carried out on **Thursday 25 December**. Contractors have requested that bins be put out earlier than normal, as they may be running early. Any urgent matters during the Christmas and New Year period can be referred to the CEO – Joanne Trezona on 9825 1114.

COUNCIL WORKS

The Country Local Government Fund water harvesting and reuse projects are winding towards completion with poly pipe laid from the CBH dam to the Complex dam in Broomehill and connected to the pump. The pump is working, and is pumping water. Contractors have been working in Tambellup to install pipe from the Sportsground tanks to Diprose Park, which will allow the park and gardens to be watered from dams rather than the scheme. The treated waste water from the Water Corp treatment plant in Tambellup is on line and being used to reticulate the Tambellup Oval.

A number of people have contacted the Shire concerned at the lack of lighting along the Railway path in Broomehill. Staff are working on rectifying this, and are seeking advice from the product supplier. We hope to have the lights operating in the near future.

The maintenance crew have been replacing pipes in the vicinity of North Terrace, in an effort to improve drainage in the area. Further drainage works will be undertaken along Tambellup West Road between Great Southern Highway and Donald St commencing mid-January 2015. The construction crew has been working on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd and Tambellup West Rd. Broomehill-Kojonup Rd is ready for sealing, and this will be completed early in December. The 3.6km section of road works on Tambellup West Rd has been stabilised, however this will not be sealed until early in 2015. All graders have been working on construction jobs during November to ensure these jobs are ready for sealing when contractors are available. The maintenance crew is also working on construction projects, widening culverts and constructing new headwalls.

Contractors have completed vegetation widening on Nardlah Rd and the sealed section of Flat Rocks Rd.

DID YOU KNOW......

That Council approval may be required to operate certain truck/prime mover/trailer combinations on Shire roads? If your truck/prime mover/trailer combination exceeds-

- The mass limit prescribed in Part 3 of the Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Regulations 2002; or
- one of the following dimension limits:
 - a width of 2.5 metres;
 - a height of 4.3 metres;
 - a length of 12.5 metres in the case of a motor vehicle that is not part of a combination; or
 - a length of 19 metres in the case of a combination;
 - any other dimension specified in the:
 - Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Regulations 2002; or
 - Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rule 2002.
- it is classified as a Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV). The Shire's roads have been classified by Main Roads WA according to various criteria (RAV Network), which determines the classification of RAV that can operate on them, and conditions may apply.

In years gone by this applied mainly to contractors with bigger combinations, however with many farmers now owning similar sized rigs, it may apply to you too. For more information go to

BULK WASTE COLLECTION

It was pleasing to see the recent bulk waste collection was well supported in both towns, with many people taking the opportunity to offload unwanted 'stuff'. However, this was a one-off event, and residents are reminded that waste should not be placed on the verge as standard practice, as it will not be collected. In the worst case, it could result in you receiving a fine for littering! If you need to dispose of extra rubbish, tokens for the Waste Transfer Station are available for purchase at both Shire Administration offices.

VANDALISM IN TAMBELLUP

Council is dismayed with the frequency of vandalism in the Tambellup townsite over the last 18 months and the resultant cost to the ratepayer. Over \$10,000 (more than \$5,000 in the last 5 months) has been paid in repairs and replacements as a result of broken windows, damage to plumbing and defacement of signage. If you see vandals in action, please report them to our local Police as soon as possible (telephone 98251003) and help with our efforts to reduce these occurrences and costs.

THUMBS DOWN

It is disappointing to report that people are continuing to interfere with Council owned pumps at all Shire dams, with the result that water supply to the town ovals, parks and gardens is being interrupted. Residents will be aware that as the weather warms up it doesn't take long before your home garden starts to show signs of water stress, and public open spaces, parks and gardens are no different in that respect. Council has recently implemented significant measures to increase the ability to harvest and reuse treated waste water and storm water to maintain these facilities and a key outcome is to keep our parks and ovals green year round for public use. If you are involved in 'tweaking' the pumps – please stop!

BARBEQUES

As the weather warms up it is great to see people out and about using the facilities provided in our parks. Just a reminder – if you are using the barbeques in Diprose Park or Holland Park please remember to scrape the hotplate when you are finished. The facilities are provided for the whole community, and your consideration will be greatly appreciated by the people who come along after you.

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **prohibited** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2014** and continues until **14 FEBRUARY 2015** inclusive when the restricted burning period commences. Only protective burning can be carried out within this period, and conditions will apply. A permit to burn must be obtained from your nearest Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager, Cindy Pearce as follows:

Patchwork / Craft Day



Evaluating promising perennials for the south coast







In conjunction with DAFWA Albany, Gillamii is looking to establish a variety trial on a property to the west of Tambellup. The trial will focus on perennial pasture species as well as some annual legumes. It will investigate how different species react to the climatic conditions in this area, and what effect this has on production.

Two of these variety trials have already been run in Gnowellen and Manjimup. They have provided invaluable information and a great place to run fieldwalks.

The site will need to be an average soil for the area; a sandy or gravelly sand duplex would be good. It should not be affected by waterlogging or salinity and will need to be fairly easy to access. The area of the trial is small, less than an acre and will comprise a number of plots established in winter and spring.

Broomehill Museum Open Day

The Broomehill Museum opened its doors last Sunday 9 November to show off its collections. Broomehill Historical Society invited visitors to view the many family histories, photographs, domestic and farm equipment, and machinery that date back to the late 1800s. The museum houses over 450 historical items from across the Broomehill district.

Many of those who attended were retired farmers who recalled the history and idiosyncrasies of particular machines. Housed in the former Shire Depot, the machinery collection also features machines used by the Broomehill Road Board. These include a horse drawn Road Grader used to make roads around the district from the early 1900s.

The Historical Society is working with the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup and heritage consultant Michelle Slarke to assess the significance of its machinery collection. Ms Slarke is keen to hear from Broomehill residents, present and past, as well as people who have donated machinery to the museum. "We are asking the Broomehill community to tell us what they know about machinery in the collection and what they consider to be important, she said, "We would like to talk with older farmers in particular.

Ern Chapman, President of Broomehill Historical Society, said the open day was also an opportunity for people to re-discover the Museum's wonderful collection, trace some long lost relatives and see Broomehill's heritage.


There will be no cafe lunches from 24 December 2014 to 2 January 2015 inclusive, however the coffee machine will be on and the cakes will be fresh!



Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Twine, A.C – Postmaster in 1894 and correspondent for the Northam Newspaper. In 1894 he was a member of the newly formed District Board of Education and appointed its Honorary Secretary. He was also a member of the Committee of the Agricultural Society and replaced J.H. Otto as Secretary in October that year. At Mutual Improvement Society concerts he played the violin and also sang (bass) and he gave a Ball on 17th October. On 5th November 1894 an impromptu concert was got up by the residents led by Thomas Norrish to say bon voyage to the Twines; A.C was posted to Nannine on the Murchison.

Tunney J – Started shearing at Goblup on 7th October 1895 but left the next day to go with a party towards the goldfields.

Tylor, Fred - First entries suggest that Fred worked in Kojonup but later it is apparent that he was working for George Norrish. In May 1879 he brought wheat to Goblup and TN exchanged it for barley and Fred went home. He called at Goblup twice in august 1880 the second time with a telegram. At the end of August 1881 at Warkalup he went horse-hunting with Johnny and Billie Bimbert. A few days later he came to Goblup for the timber that TN was lending to his brother George. At Martinup on 12th September 1882 TN sold his bay mare to Fred for £20 and late in November Fred was at Goblup with George Norrish on the way to Josiah Norrish's - Tambellarup. On 6th April 1893 TN was horse-hunting at Mandelup and found a mare belonging to Fred Tylor and took her to Kojonup. Two days later Johnny and Fred were horse-hunting at Warkalup. On 4th July the same year, Fred Tylor arrived at Goblup to see if TN could let George Norrish have a load of barley straw and next day he was back with a wagon and three horses for the straw; Bill the Emigrant was with him. On 22nd July 1883 he was at Goblup again for ½ ton of chaff and spent a day helping to cut it. He returned about 10 days later with George Norrish's team to get chaff from George Whitton.

Tylor, James – A blacksmith whose smith and house were on Greenhills Road across from St Peter's Church. He married Anna Louisa Toovey. In 1890 to 1892 he shod 2 of TN's trap horses and repaired the plough (twice). On 28th November 1890, the Tylor's daughter was confirmed by Bishop Parry and on 16th March 1893 Mrs and Miss Tylor called at Goblup. By 1895 James Tylor appears to have been working in Broome Hill as TN's son, will. Took the trap into town for Mr Tylor to cut the tyres – cost £1.15.0. The Tylors moved to Katanning about 1899.

Van Zuilecom, Louis Frederick – In 1860s he had property near Kojonup and in 1871 was elected to the first Kojonup Road Board. He was Chairman and also Secretary. In October 1879 he leased Fairfield from William Henry Graham and expected to stay there with his family until Graham's return about 1888. The Van Zuilecom's were frequent visitors to Goblup and later Sunnyside, social calls, Church services, and on farming and community matters. In august 1891 one of the daughters wrote "Tomorrow the Grahams arrive and are to take charge, so we shall be busy packing up."

Van Zuilecom, Louis Henry – Eldest son of Louis Frederick. On 6th February 1895 YN helped Harry to thresh some wheat, so he was obviously at Fairfield but it was not until November that year that TN wrote "Henry Van Zuilecom is in charge at Fairfield." On 9th July 1898 Mrs L.F. Van Zuilecom (second wife Violet Toll) and members of the family were at TN's 61st birthday party and various members called during July, August and September. Henry was elected to Broome Hill Road Board in December 1899 but in March 1900 he was killed when his horse, harnessed to a trap, bolted and tried to jump a gate. Harry was buried in the Eticup Cemetery beside his Mother, Emily.




