

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- Council has granted permission for the Tambellup Tennis Club to renew its Club Restricted Liquor License for the 2014-2015 season.
- Council supported a proposal to rename the section of Norrish Road from the Great Southern Highway to the Tieline Road intersection to Tieline Road. Landowners in the vicinity have been contacted and the proposal is to be advertised for comment before Council makes its final decision to proceed.

COUNCIL WORKS

Maintenance grading and patching of gravel roads has been completed on the following roads during September: Punchmirup North Rd, Chillicup Rd, West Peringillup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Clinic Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Palomar Rd, Pindellup Rd, Stock Route Rd, Simpson Rd, Washington Rd, Des Wray Rd, Withams Rd, Parnell Rd, Cemetery Rd, Moore Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Pallinup South Rd, and White Rd. Works continued on the widening of the next section of Tambellup West Rd.

Council greatly appreciates residents advising of trouble spots in the Shire's gravel road network. Staff are working to repair known blowouts, and will attend as soon as possible.

ETNA ROAD

As residents may be aware, Etna Road is closed to all traffic at present. Etna Road incurred significant damage when the grader became bogged while maintenance grading in the area. Works to repair the damage are underway, however the road needs to be brought back to shape and the area is still very wet, which is hampering efforts at the moment. When the road has dried out, repairs will be completed and the road will be opened as soon as possible. We apologise for any inconvenience, but ask for your patience, as repairs that are not done correctly at this time will fail once heavy traffic is using the road.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE

The Tambellup Sports Pavilion Advisory Committee met with the project architect at its last meeting, to discuss the feedback received from clubs on the concept plans developed for the Pavilion upgrade. The architect explained that there were no suggestions presented that could not be accommodated within the plans for the new facility, and that it came back to the budget available for the project. Council's application to the Department of Sport and Recreation's CSRFF program was submitted in September, and we anticipate we will have an outcome by December or January. At that time the budget will be confirmed and the plans can be further refined in consultation with user groups. Feedback received from the clubs will be considered, however all groups should be aware that there will need to be compromise all round, as the funds allocated to the project will not cover every request.

The next stage of the project is to determine the management requirements for the new facility. It is Councils preference that the facility be managed by a representative Management Committee. The Management Committee will be responsible for running the facility, including hiring and events, and as such, will require sound procedures and policies to be in place. We will be talking to other Management Committees in the region to find out how they are set up, and what works well before embarking on this process.

The committee is still seeking expressions of interest from anyone in the community who might be interested in new and innovative ways of raising funds for the upgrade project. Many communities in the region have come up with some successful proposals to fund community projects in their towns, so if you are interested, please contact Pam at the Shire on 98253555.

ROADSIDE CLEARING

Residents in the western parts of the Shire will be aware that roadside clearing is being completed on a number of roads at present. This task is required to enable programmed construction works to be completed, including the gravel resheeting of Pindellup Rd. The mulch head being used is more cost efficient that the methods previously used, and is doing an excellent job. The objective of the exercise is to improve the safety of the road for all users, and this activity is a necessary component of the works It is disappointing to note that a contractor engaged to complete the job has experienced vandalism to his equipment when left onsite overnight, and his staff have been intimidated by passers by whilst on the job. This is not appropriate behaviour, and anyone with any information about the vandalism to the contractors equipment is asked to contact the Shire.

DOG AND CAT REGISTRATIONS

Residents are reminded that all dog and cat registrations are due for renewal on <u>31 October</u> each year. Notification will be sent to owners of dogs and cats with registration expiring in 2043. RECYCLE BIN EXCHANGE SERVICE

Residents are reminded the recycle bin exchange service has commenced at the Broomehill and Tambellup Waste Transfer Stations. This service is provided for residents who do not receive a fortnightly kerbside recycling collection. Those residents wishing to use the service can bring their full recycling bin to either the Broomehill or Tambellup waste transfer station and swap it for an empty one. The Transfer Station attendant will empty the full bin into the recycling container and put that bin into the exchange stock.

Please be aware bins must be in a clean and tidy condition, and must not be damaged. Damaged or excessively dirty bins will not be exchanged.

It should be noted this service applies to recycling only. Any bins found to contain mixed waste will result in the relevant fee being charged to the person presenting the bin.

BULK RUBBISH COLLECTION

Residents are reminded that the Shire will be providing a Bulk rubbish pickup for Broomehill and Tambellup townsite residents on the 6th and 7th October 2014. The bulk pick up is for items that are not normally collected as part of the weekly wheelie bin pick up service.

All residents in the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites are invited to neatly stack bulk rubbish items out on the verge between now and 3rd October2014. Warren Blackwood Waste will collect all rubbish and disused materials on Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th October 2014.

All rubbish and disused materials on the verges will be collected. If you have vehicles or other large items on your property that you wish to be picked up, please contact Marni at the Shire office on 9825 3555 by 30th September 2014 with your address and the number of vehicles/items you wish to be picked up. Warren Blackwood Waste will bring the necessary equipment to retrieve large items from your property if required.

SECURE FARM WATER SUPPLIES

Get your Farm Water Supply audit done now and make the most of tank discounts at Wagin Woolorama 2015, and get rebates of up to half the cost of improving water supplies and distribution.

The Department of Water rebate scheme provides up to \$15,000 in rebates every 10 years towards:

- gutters and tanks;
- increasing dam storage and/or artificial catchment;
- · water distribution system components;
- groundwater supply development.

To obtain rebates, you will have a farm water audit done, which takes 2-3 hours on farm. The cost of the audit is eligible for an additional rebate of up to \$500.







38 motocross riders slammed whoops, carved berms and flew high over jumps at Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club Inc (CDMC) Club Day on Saturday 13th September 2014. As this was a non-competitive event our affiliated body Motorcycling WA stipulates that race results are not to be published.

Motorcycling WA also require competitive junior riders (under 16 years) to show that they are competent in the sport prior to racing. Junior Riders refer to this as "Kick Start" training. It consists of a theory test, practical test and attendance at a 5 hour annual coaching clinic by a Motorcycling Australia approved coach.

This year John Young from Kojonup hosted CDMC "Kick Start" and general training clinic on Saturday 27th September at the Rockwell Flats Track. CDMC appreciates John's enthusiasm and motocross knowledge in teaching the next generation of riders.

For the 2015 season, CDMC plan to hold 3 competitive events, where club members who ride will earn points towards a trophy.

ETICUP TO BROOMEHILL

When word went out in the 1880s that possibly a railway would be built between Albany and Perth settlers around Kojonup and Eticup, like all those dwelling between the tow major centres, yarned long and hard as to its possible route. (So too did Arthur River and Williams.)

For a variety of reasons each town, was disregarded. Eticup was superseded for the new town of Broomehill—named after the Governor of WA—Sir Frederick Napier Broome.

Once the actual route became public Eticup's astute business men assessed their options; no way did they sit on their hands.

J.J. Garrity, Eticup's postmaster made sure he continued as Broomehill's postmaster. Storekeepers, Patrick and John Garrity both ensured they had stores with a gallon licence situated in the new centre. Similarly the brothers David and Rudolph operated businesses in Broomehill.

Patrick Carmody eventually obtained the license for running the Refreshment Room on the railway station.

One by one Eticup townsfolk forsook their small homes, their gardens, their orchards and drifted elsewhere—perhaps to Broomehill; some to be near Kojonup friends, while other adventurous ones to the promising growing town of Katanning.

As the railway line from Albany snaked closer and closer settlers took the opportunity to buy produce from the railway storekeepers such as boots and work gear. In turn they sold fresh rations to the gangs who were not slow at frequenting the hotels so much so that complaints were made of drunken navies and the police had to make more frequent visits.

The Norrish family augmented their annual income by Mrs Thomas Norrish, it is said, to have sold to the gangers, 200 loaves of bread a day for some weeks—all with home-made yeast and cooked in a wood-fired oven.

As construction drew nearer district residents used the train for personal reasons—to procure goods from Albany; send skins and sandalwood down the line to buyers; and even for social reasons such as taking a ride to enjoy a couple shopping days and sight-seeing in the picturesque seaside town, the cost being 3 pennies a mile.

However farm work was not neglected. Crops were planted; sheep shorn. The Climie brothers acted as agents for the farmers situated along the line and in 1888 the Eticup farmers sent to Albany their combined wool clip to be sold—eight trucks. Each truck held 18 bales with freight being 60 cents per bale. Agriculturally Broomehill district has come a long way since then.

Suspicious fires in the area – What you can do as a member of the community

If you have - Seen something - Know something, than Say something.....

These deliberately lit fires place our local volunteer fire fighters and other emergency services people under extreme pressure. You as a community play an important role, as you may see something out of place and this maybe just what the police are looking for. Remember the next deliberately lit fire may destroy property, injure or even kill someone.

What you can do – If you see someone behaving suspiciously or a vehicle at a location that doesn't seem right record the information and report it to crime stopper or the local police. Note the description of the person / people – gender, age, height, build, hair

colour, eye colour, facial hair, clothing appearance and other distinguishing features.

If you are making notes of suspicious vehicle the following information can assist authorities, registration, make, model, colour and any damage to the vehicle.

Bushfire Arson is the deliberate lighting of fires with the intent to cause damage or with disregard for the damage that may result.

Bushfire arson is a crime with severe penalties given to people that deliberately light bushfires. Penalties range from 10 yrs – 25 yrs imprisonment. Where a person dies as a result of arson the perpetrator may be charged with murder or manslaughter as well.

Arson damages approx \$1.6 billion of property each year.

If you have information on a fire or suspect somebody of deliberately lighting a fire call crime stoppers on 1800 333 000 Information to Crime Stoppers is confidential.

To report fires call 000.


