FROM THE JULY COUNCIL MEETING

- Council endorsed the proposal by the Tambellup St John Ambulance Sub Centre to extend or replace their existing building on the corner of Henry and Norrish St. Council endorsement was required as the building is on a Reserve, with the management order (which states that the land can only be used for the purpose of 'Ambulance Centre') being held by the Shire.
- Council granted a rates concession to the Tambellup Golf Club for the 2014-2015 year.
- Council endorsed the 'Local Emergency Evacuation Plan' as presented by the Local Emergency Management Committee. The plan provides guidelines and information for planning and executing an evacuation in an emergency situation.
- Council endorsed the appointment of the Community Emergency Services Manager as a Fire Control Officer for the Shire for the 2014-2015 fire season.
- Council agreed to contribute \$500 to the Broomehill Recreational Complex in support of the proposal to host a Maggie Dent seminar in October 2014.

FARM WATER PIPES THROUGH CULVERTS

Residents are reminded that Council approval is required to be obtained prior to running farm water pipes through culverts. Council staff are currently cleaning culverts across the shire, and some damage to pipes has been incurred through the staff not being aware that a pipe was in place.

Councils policy 'Laying Water Pipes Under Roads' states that applications must be made in writing to the Chief Executive Officer, and should include a location sketch. Once approval is granted, the location of the pipe should be marked either side of the road with a white post bearing the words 'Water Pipe' in black letters not less than 65mm high. It would also be appreciated if a joiner could be located at either end of the culvert so staff can disconnect the pipe while culvert cleaning is being undertaken, then reconnect.

Your assistance in this regard would be appreciated.

COUNCIL WORKS

Water issues are still a priority in both towns at the moment, with a focus on getting all water supply and reticulation systems working efficiently before the summer. As part of the Shire's Country Local Government Fund Stormwater Harvesting projects, contractors will be installing a solar pump and pipework to transfer water from the CBH Dam to the Broomehill Recreational Complex, and will also be undertaking a complete maintenance audit on all reticulation systems and fitting a new filtering system to the Broomehill Town Dam to alleviate problems in the summer months.

In Tambellup, the Water Corporation has commissioned the treated waste water system, and the new tanks at the Sportsground are plumbed and operational.

Contractors are working on erecting fencing around the new water tanks in Tambellup, and also around the newly extended Town Dam in Broomehill.

The construction crew is currently working on Warrenup Rd, gravel resheeting. From there, they will move to Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, where widening and sealing of a 1.2km section will be carried out. It is anticipated all gravel widening will be completed prior to Christmas so bitumen sealing can be completed during the warmer weather.

The tree mulcher is currently working on Pallinup Rd, finishing vegetation clearing on the recently gravelled section. From here, it will move to Warrenup Rd, Tambellup West Rd and Pindellup Rd.

The maintenance crew has been working on culvert headwalls on Pallinup South Rd. This has been a large job, with rain causing delays.

The maintenance graders have been grading bitumen edges around the Shire during July.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT

As residents will be aware Council has embarked on the journey to upgrade the Tambellup Sports Pavilion. This process was commenced last year, with a Feasibility Study being undertaken to identify the needs of the community in respect of a multi-use facility at the Tambellup Sports Ground. Council has endorsed the recommendation of the Feasibility Study, that is to construct a new facility, and incorporate a new synthetic bowling green. An Advisory Committee has been established to steer the project and work with Council to achieve the best outcomes for the community. The committee consists of representatives from each of the sporting and community groups in Tambellup, members of Council's Building committee and Shire staff. The committee has met on three occasions to date. Concept plans for a new facility were developed last year to support the Feasibility Study. David Heaver, from H&H Architects, met with Council and the committee during July 2014 to explain the drawings, and to emphasise that they are only a working design. Feedback obtained from all clubs indicated there are a number elements which need to be included in the next phase of the design stage, and the committee will be charged with liaising with clubs to prioritise the features that are included. It is intended that the final design will meet the needs of the community, however some compromise may be required to ensure the project fits within the budget

Work has commenced on an application to the Department of Sport and Recreation's CSRFF program, with an outcome expected by January 2015. Additional funding is being sourced from the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund 2012-2013 allocation and Council's Reserve Funds. Council has agreed to take out a self supporting loan for the balance of funding required to complete the project.

The committee is hopeful that the community will be able to assist with raising funds for the project. The Tambellup Cropping Group has already indicated it will assist, and it is proposed to establish a small sub committee to be responsible for funding initiatives.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS GROUND SOUTHERN ENTRANCE

As has been reported previously, Council, in conjunction with the Southern Link VROC, was successful in securing funding through the Country Local Government Fund to complete infrastructure projects relating to the harvesting and reuse of waste water. In Tambellup, a major element of the project was to construct three new concrete water tanks at the Tambellup Sports Ground, which will receive treated waste water from the Water Corporation Treatment Plant, as well as storm water transferred from the No. 1 Dam on Jam Creek Rd. The tanks will be connected to the irrigation system on the oval, as well as the Diprose Park reticulation system. The tanks have been located adjacent to the existing tanks near the southern entrance to the Sportsground off Henry St, necessitating the closure of this entrance.

Initially it was intended that the closure would be temporary, however Council has now determined that the entrance will remain closed until such time that the forthcoming upgrade works at the Tambellup Pavilion are well progressed. At that time the requirement for a second entrance will be assessed.

WASTE TRANSFER STATIONS

The Waste Transfer Stations are now up and running, under the management of Warren Blackwood Waste. To date it appears to have been a smooth transition to the new arrangements and we thank everyone for their patience. Residents are reminded Waste Transfer Station passes are required to be presented at the sites in order to deposit waste. These can be purchased at the Shire Offices between 8.30am and 4.00pm Monday to Friday.

The construction of the facilities was made possible with funding through the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund to the Southern Link VROC, of which the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is a member council.

RECYCLING IN BROOMEHILL AND TAMBELLUP

As residents will be aware, Warren Blackwood Waste has been engaged by the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup to manage the Broomehill and Tambellup Waste Transfer Stations.

Warren Blackwood Waste is committed to recycling and resource recovery in order to reduce the impact of unwanted waste on the environment.

The recycling bin service is a simple easy to use method of collecting and recycling items. By using the yellow top recycling bin service correctly, or by delivering your recyclable materials to the Transfer Stations, you are contributing, in a combined community effort, to reduce the amount of rubbish that is directed to landfill facilities each year.

In addition to this, you will be helping the community to reduce the amount of natural resources that are being

To ensure that you are benefiting the environment, all you have to do is follow these simple guidelines: Recyclable items that **CAN BE** placed into your recycle bin:

- All cardboard boxes including cereal boxes, soap powder boxes and packaging boxes
- All plastic bottles and containers with recycling symbol codes 1,2,3 or 5
- Clean newspaper, glossy magazines and leaflets don't need to be bundled
- Glass bottles and jars (no broken glass or plates) please remove lids from glass containers
- Steel tines and cans, including aerosol cans please remove caps
- Milk and juice containers please rinse

Please don't bag recyclables in the bin - they can be loose and mixed

These items CANNOT be placed in your yellow top recycling bin.

- Food scraps and wrappings (including plastic bags)
- Garden refuse and clippings
- Clothing and toys
- Polystyrene
- Broken glass
- Needles and syringes

- Rubber and leather
- Mulch and leaves
- Timber or building materials
- Crockery and ceramics
- Nappies
- Oil, acid or chemicals
- Batteries or metal (however these can be separated and deposited for recycling on site at the Waste Transfer Stations)

TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENT LIVING SENIORS ACCOMMODATION







As can be seen from the photos, the units are starting to take on a 'nearly there' appearance, with the installation of paving, reticulation systems and landscaping being the most obvious activity underway at the moment. The plants selected for the gardens are all low care once established, and will complement the surrounds. All internal and external fencing has been erected, and individual water tanks installed just in time to be filled by some heavy falls. Work is continuing inside the units to install kitchen, bathroom and laundry cabinetry, tiling, electricals, painting and floor coverings.

We have had a number of people submitting applications to rent a unit, which is fantastic. As the units near completion, we anticipate more people will be in contact with the Shire. If you are interested and would like an information package, or would just like more information, please contact Judy or Pam at the Shire.

The Tambellup Senior Citizens Unit Management Committee will shortly be handing over the responsibility for management of the existing George St units to the Shire. We sincerely thank this committee (Barbara Groves, Beth Schlueter, Pauline Roosendaal, Adrianne Bowman, Jim Hull and Evelyn Halden) for their support and contribution to the provision of seniors' accommodation in Tambellup over many years.

Council has established the Independent Living Seniors Accommodation (ILSA) Committee, which comprises community members and Council representatives. The ILSA committee, in conjunction with the Shire, will take responsibility for the management of both the existing and new units. This is a new era for our community, and we wish the new committee well in their endeavours.

The new committee has met on a number of occasions, to formalise matters including policies, procedures and the Tenants Handbook. While these are the dry, dusty details of a project such as this, they are an essential tool for the successful operations of all the units, providing consistent information and procedures for all involved.





Waldron welcomes \$60,000 boost to local school playgrounds

Living a healthy, active lifestyle has just become easier for students at three schools in the Wagin electorate, after \$60,000 of State Government funding was granted to upgrade playground equipment.

Another round of funding for the playground and shade structure scheme is expected to be announced in early 2015.

FIRE RETARDANT PLANTS

The selection of fire retardant trees and plants, and careful consideration of their placement, may assist in preventing damage to your property should a bushfire pass through the area.

Fire retardant plants create a barrier between flying embers and your property. These plants also lessen the impact of potential ember attack as they do not produce excessive amounts of bark and leaves which carried by strong winds experienced during a bushfire.

Yes, all trees and plants can burn under the right circumstances. The extent to which they will burn depends on the intensity of the bushfire itself and the amount of ember and flame attack. Fire retardant plants normally burn at a lesser rate than other plant varieties.

Usually fire retardant trees have thick, well defined bark and few branched low to the ground. These trees and shrubs rarely shed large quantities of leaves and twigs and their seeds are usually enclosed in woody capsules.

Around the home, trees should always be planted away from buildings, with branches and twigs regularly trimmed to ensure they do not overhang your house.

A list of fire retardant species of plants can be sourced from the local library or garden nursery.

OLD ETICUP

On Monday 2 June (WA Day—once called Foundation Day) the Kojonup Historical Society held its annual Bus Trip by visiting the site of the once Eticup village which was a thriving little centre along the Broomehill—Kojonup Road about 6 km from Broomehill.

Anne Guazzelli, a member of the Broomehill Historical Society met the bus at the historic school ruins opposite the equally historic property, "Oak farm" established long ago by the Norrish family, descendants of Corporal Richard Norrish of the 96th Regiment. A detachment of this regiment had travelled in 1847, from Van Diemen's Land to relive the 51st Regiment stationed in Kojonup's Military Barracks. After his discharge Richard Norrish returned to settle at Kojonup's Warkelup Spring situated beside the present Kojonup/Broomehill Road. Across the paddock from the ruins of one on their buildings stands a pillar marking the site where Richard Norrish sowed the first crop known in the Kojonup Shire.

As the bus travelled towards Broomehill Anne kindly gave directions and descriptions of Eticup's past. Joan O'Halloran also gave a fascinating description of the thriving flour mill on the once "Bermuda" property, backing her comments with some indisputable photos. (The 1929 Depression took its toll of its future.)

Some places noted along the historic trip were—W.H. Graham's impressive two-storey "Fairfield" house, originally built to face the (Lord) Brassey Road which ran parallel to today's road.

Eticup cemetery was a little down a side road. There members read some impressive headstones including one marking the grave of Richard Norrish's second son, Thomas who became an esteemed member of Eticup and Broomehill.

The site of Eticup's once St Peter's Church of England, was pointed out.

In front of the present day "Eticup" property, which was the site of Eticup's hotel, members viewed an obelisk's map indicating the location of Eticup residents who dwelt thereabouts—including two stores and two smithys.

On reaching Broomehill the travellers visited the Historical Society's Museum which they found bursting with historical facts, photos and relics.

After a warming lunch of soup, sandwiches and coffee at the Henry Jones Caf'e (a perfect venue for those of historic interests) members continued their tip by viewing afar Thomas Norrish's "Sunnyside" homestead and arrived back at their Kojonup headquarters by 3pm.

Many were the thoughts of Eticup the small busy centre that promised so much; however the building of the Perth railway, a few kilometres to its east, resulted sadly in its inevitable downward course.




