

FROM THE JUNE COUNCIL MEETING

Following the removal of the community notice board in Broomehill from the Post Office corner, Council has determined that it will be reinstalled adjacent to the Broomehill RSL building.

Council formally appointed Mrs Di Holly as its delegate to the Hidden Treasures of the Great Southern committee.

Council endorsed the 2014-2015 Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Fire Break Order and Information Booklet. This will be distributed with rates notices and will also be available at the Shire offices later in July.

COUNCIL WORKS

The construction of the new water tanks at the Tambellup Sportsground is nearing completion, with the infrastructure to connect the tanks to the Water Corporation Treatment Plant, and then to the oval reticulation system being installed. During July, the area surrounding the tanks will be fenced off to restrict access. The commissioning of the treated waste water into the system will also be completed in July.

Construction of the attendant huts at the Waste Transfer Stations is underway, and they will be ready for the opening of the facilities on 3 July. The construction crew is currently working on Warrenup Rd, carrying out gravel resheeting. Contractors have been engaged to assist with this project, with some roadside vegetation clearing yet to be completed.

A second construction crew is working on the Beejenup Rd/Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd intersection, which is a Black Spot funded project. As a result maintenance grading this month has been limited to one grader, with two graders working on the construction projects to have them finalised by the end of the financial year. Sealing of the Beejenup Rd works will be completed in the next financial year. The maintenance grader has been working west of Broomehill.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY SERVICES MANAGER

Council recently entered into a partnership agreement with the Shire of Katanning and the Department of Fire and Emergency Services to engage a Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM) to work with the Fire brigades and emergency services in both shires. We are pleased to advise that Cindy Pearce will start in the new shared role on 1 July 2014.

Cindy has for the past few years been employed in the same role with the Shires of Katanning, Woodanilling, Wagin and West Arthur, and brings a wealth of experience in ongound incident management, volunteer management, training, and administrative and legislative compliance. Welcome Cindy!

WASTE TRANSFER STATIONS

As residents will be aware, the Waste Transfer Stations will commence operations at the Broomehill and Tambellup Tip Sites from Thursday 3 July 2014. Warren Blackwood Waste have been contracted by Council to manage both sites, which will be manned and open at the following times:

Sunday	9.00am - 12.00 noon	1.00pm - 4.00pm
Monday	8.30am - 12.00 noon	1.00pm - 4.30pm

From 3 July 2014 there will be no public access to the tip face at either site. Waste delivery will be accepted with an approved Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Waste Transfer Station Pass, which can be purchased from the Shire Offices Monday-Friday 8.30am-4.00pm. Passes are available in 5 token (\$14.00), 10 token (\$28.00) and 20 token (\$45.60) 'denominations'. Please note charges only apply to waste that cannot be recycled – all clean, sorted and uncontaminated recyclables are FREE.

Property owners who do not receive a weekly kerbside rubbish collection should have received their Annual 52 token Tip Pass in the mail late in June, along with a request that they apply for additional Tip Passes for residents of other homes on their properties. We encourage you to do this early, to minimise inconvenience to your tenants.

For residents who receive rubbish and recycling collection services, this will be unchanged. If you need to take additional waste to the Waste Transfer Station, you will need to purchase a Tip Pass from the Shire office. The intent of constructing the Waste Transfer Stations is to control the amount and nature of waste going to landfill in our shire, thereby extending the lifespan of our tip sites. All residents are encouraged to recycle where possible – and it is free to deposit recyclables!

ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS – COUNTRY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND 2012-2013

Council has recently been advised that the Shire's Country Local Government Fund 2012-2013 allocation which had been withdrawn, has been reinstated as part of the State Budget. At the June meeting, Council confirmed the following projects will be carried out using this source of funding:

Tambellup Sports Pavilion Upgrade	
Broomehill Administration Office Solar Energy - To install a photovoltaic system to help offset energy costs associated with the Broomehill Archive Repository	
Broomehill Hall Building Improvements - To complete renovation works to the under-stage area of the Hall. Works include lining of the walls, new flooring and lighting.	
Tambellup Hall – Roof and Ablutions Renovations - To carry out structural repairs to the roof of the Hall and renovations to ablutions.	
Total funding	\$374,889

TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENT LIVING SENIORS ACCOMMODATION

Councillors and staff were invited to a site inspection of the units during June, to see first hand the works that have been completed so far. External works have been largely completed, with all services connected, paving completed, the gazebo is under construction and fencing is underway. The driveways and landscaping will be commencing in July. Internally, kitchen, bathroom and laundry cabinets are being installed, tiling of wet areas has been completed and painting is underway.

The project manager advises that although they are running a couple of weeks behind schedule, they are confident of making this time up, to finish at the end of September as planned.

A number of applications for rental of a unit have been received already, which is fantastic. If you are thinking of applying, we encourage you to contact Pam or Judy at the Shire for the information you will need.


BANNERS IN THE TERRACE



PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR A STORM

Preparing your family and home for a storm is your responsibility. If you live in a storm prone area, you should make it a priority between March and May to get your home ready inside and out for the winter period. There are a few simple steps that could help assist you minimise damage.

- Check your roof and gutters for damage or loose material.
- Clear gutters and downpipes of leaves and blockages.
- Trim branches near your home and hire a contractor to clear trees from power lines.
- Clear rubbish from your yard, balcony or patio and put away loose objects.
- Prepare an emergency kit with portable radio, touch, spare batteries, first aid kit and family emergency plan.
- Ensure you family understand storms and the risk.
- Prepare an emergency plan including a relocation plan in case your home becomes flooded. Consider what you will do with your pets and know how to turn off the gas electricity and water supplies.
- Display a list of emergency phone numbers.
- Check you have adequate home and contents insurance.

If your home has been badly damaged and you need help call the SES on 132 500.



TAMBELLUP POLICE STATION

Welcome to the first of what I believe may be a regular article from the Tambellup Police Station. For those who don't yet know who I am, my name is Simon Bickers and I am the Officer in Charge of the Tambellup Police Station. The Tambellup Police Station covers the Broomehill – Tambellup Shire including the communities of both Tambellup and Broomehill.

The focus of the first of these articles will be on traffic management. There is a commitment made by the Western Australia Police to manage road users. This typically takes one of two directions; either education (such as this article) or enforcement (traffic infringement notices or charges in court). As one of the major contributing factors to road deaths is driving whilst intoxicated it probably makes sense to start there. Thus the topic of this article is Alcohol Enforcement.

The following points help to emphasise why alcohol and driving are a bad combination:

- Alcohol is one of the three major contributing factors in fatal and serious crashes in WA (the other factors are speeding and not wearing restraints).
- Alcohol impairs one's ability to control a vehicle: research suggests at a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of 0.05 per cent, the risk of being involved in a crash is doubled.
- With a BAC of 0.08, you are 7 times more likely to crash and 25 times more likely with a BAC of 0.15.
- In 2013, 18% of fatal crashes attended by WA Police were reported to have involved a driver or rider with a BAC equal to or greater than 0.05.

For those who have not been in the position to experience the legal ramifications of driving with an excessive BAC here are a few points:

- The penalties for Drink Driving have increased.
- Novice Drivers will lose their licence (on conviction) and will have to retake their driving test before driving again.
- It is illegal to drive with a BAC of 0.05 and above. The **minimum** penalty is 3 demerit points and a \$250 fine. At 0.08 and above you are disqualified from driving for a **minimum** of 6 months (first offence).
- A person located driving with a BAC in excess of 0.08 will be sent to court and will also be immediately subject to a Disqualification Notice. This notice prohibits driving immediately on service for a period of 28 days.

The point made by the WA Police is that driving with an elevated BAC has a massive cost to the community as well as to the individual. There are however steps to be taken to prevent you becoming a statistic:

- Plan ahead. If you are going out plan a way of getting home that does not involve you driving (consider a taxi).
- If that is not possible plan to stay with friends or designate a reliable person to remain alcohol free for the evening.
- Party hosts should serve water, soft and low-alcohol drinks and plenty of food. Consider providing taxis for your guests.
- Men should not drink more than 2 standard drinks in the first hour and 1 standard drink every following hour. Women should not drink more than 1 standard drink every hour.

Please remember that taking responsibility for your own actions is only part of the solution. A good friend takes care of those they are drinking with and will not let someone else drink and drive. Here at Tambellup Police Station alcohol detection is just one focus of our traffic management plan for July, so please expect to see Senior Constable WALKER and I on the roads soon.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Taylor, **N** – Land Agent at Broome Hill. On 7th September 1907, TN's sons, Richard and Will, went to Broome Hill to a farewell social for N Taylor.

Taylor – A shoemaker referred to by TN in 1879 and 1880 only. He worked at Goblup from 14th June to 5th July 1879 when TN settled with him for the work he had done for the men. He was at Goblup seven times during January, February, March and April 1880 but TN does not indicate whether he did any work. On the last call he was accompanied by a man named McGuiness. On 12th May 1880 a Mrs Taylor and another woman called at Goblup.

Thomas, George – Worked with his brother William of the Albany firm of builders, Green & Thomas. Married Joseph Nelson's elder daughter Charlotte and was grandfather of Ivan and Eric Thomas of Katanning. George was a member of the first team to come up from Albany to build Sunnyside in 1883.

Thomas, J – On 28th May 1862 when told by Crossland what Thomas was doing with the fowls, WHG rode to Eticup and found the fowl in the pot. Thomas was tried at Albany on 25th June for stealing WHG's fowl and got 3 months. On 25th June 1863, J Thomas was at Eticup having come from Pootenup.

Thomas, William – Partner in the building firm Green & Thomas of Albany and married to Christen Norrish's sister Celia. He and Green were builders of Sunnyside Broome Hill. In January 1892, William and his brother George were working in Broome Hill. Soon after this, William's son Henry spent several months working at Sunnyside with his uncle William Wray (Christen's brother) who was leasing from TN. In December 1892 William Thomas worked at Goblup doing some plastering. He was back in August 1895 to plaster some of the other buildings at Golbup and in September he erected the headstone on the grave of TN's and Christen's son George at the Eticup cemetery and the railing around the Norrish plot.

Thomson, "Elephant" – Came to Fairfield on 6th December 1864 and WHG took him on for a week at 2/- a day. His work included mowing and cocking hay, carting stuff for the hay stathels and hay carting. Finished 20th December.

Thomson – Unidentified. On 2nd February 1893, the road Board let £10 of road work to Thomson.

Thompson – The Thompson's of Nardlah did not come to Broome Hill until after TN's death and are not mentioned in his diaries. A booklet held at the Broomehill Museum gives the early history of Nardlah.

When recycled, over 90% of the materials in mobile phones can be recovered and used as raw materials for new products. The materials recovered can be used to make everything from plastic fence posts to stainless steel products.

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is working with MobileMuster, the official product stewardship program of the telecommunications industry in Australia, to provide a free recycling service to its residents. MobileMuster accepts all brands of mobile phones, plus their batteries, chargers and accessories. Everything collected is recycled to the highest environmental standard for resource recovery with nothing being resold. We do encourage deleting or removing any data that you want to keep from your SIM card or mobile phone, although any data left on the device is destroyed in the recycling process.

MobileMuster recycle envelopes are available at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, the Tambellup Post Office and the Broomehill Post Office.




