### **COUNCIL WORKS**

A number of major construction jobs are underway on roads at present. Tambellup West Rd and Broomehill-Kojonup Rd are both undergoing widening works, with sealing to be completed later in the year when the weather is warmer. Vegetation widening has been completed on Pallinup Rd and Warrenup Rd, and the vegetation mulcher has been working on Tambellup West Rd.

The maintenance crew has been cleaning culverts across the Shire, and working to complete the extension to the culvert on South Pallinup Rd when the weather has been favourable. The crew will be widening culverts on construction jobs in coming weeks.

Finishing touches are being completed on the Stormwater Harvesting/Waste Water Reuse projects in both towns. The funding received from the Country Local Government Fund (Royalties for Regions) through the Southern Link VROC enabled Council to install three 135 kilolitre concrete tanks at the oval, which will hold treated waste water from the Water Corporation treatment plant. This will be reticulated onto the oval and town parks and gardens. The fencing around the tanks has been completed, and the Water Corporation is finalising the installation of equipment required to transfer the water from the treatment plant to the tanks.

In Broomehill, the works included the expansion of the town dam, which was completed some months ago. More recently, the fencing around the dam has been completed, trees inside the dam have been removed and the pipe from the dam to the school has been buried.

With water being harvested from the new CBH hardstand area on Nardlah Rd, Council has installed a solar pump on the holding pond located there, and will install piping to enable this water to be transferred to the rec Complex dam.

# HIDDEN TREASURES OF THE GREAT SOUTHERN BLOOM FESTIVAL

As you may have heard on ABC radio, the Hidden Treasures Bloom Festival is on again. The Festival runs from 13th September to 19th of October, with a range of events happening across the Hidden Treasures region including self-drive tours, wildlife and wildflower walks, long table lunches, train rides, garden tours, family fun, art exhibitions and market days. The Hidden Treasures region includes the Shires of Woodanilling, Kent, Katanning, Kojonup, Broomehill-Tambellup, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup and Cranbrook.

The official opening will be held in Woodanilling on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> September, and John Cecil from the ABC will be broadcasting the Great Southern morning program from there.

# THUMBS DOWN......

......to those responsible for smashing the plate glass windows at the Tambellup Sports Pavilion. Last time these were broken the cost to repair was in the vicinity of \$2600, and we don't expect that this will be any cheaper. Security photos taken at the time provide clear images of children in the area who can be identified – are they yours??

It is also disappointing to note the vandalism to the Diprose park signs – these were purchased especially to help brighten up the park area, at a cost of around \$6000, having been assured they would withstand vandalism and graffiti. This is obviously not the case, especially when something like a golf club is used to belt dents into the signs, as was witnessed by people in the area. Police have been notified and enquiries are continuing.

Council has taken steps to install security cameras in many public areas of both communities, and the images are clear enough to assist the Shire and Police in identifying people who in the area at the time incidents such as those above are committed.

We are fortunate to live in two small communities where we all know each other, and our children are able to move around the community freely in safety. However, this can lead to complacency by parents and other adults. Yes, your children are safe, but what about where they are playing and who they are with? Do you know?

# FIRE BREAK ORDERS

The 2014-2015 Fire Break order has been distributed with rates notices to all rate payers. If you have not received a copy, they are available at both Shire offices and the Tambellup Post Office. Please take the time to have a look and check your responsibilities as a land owner or occupier with regard to the removal of fire hazards from your property.

The Fire Brigades will be undertaking inspections of townsite properties during September to check for fire hazards. Owners of properties deemed to present an unacceptable fire risk will be requested to undertake works to remove the hazard, and additional inspections will be undertaken to ensure compliance. This activity is aimed at reducing the risk of fire, not only for you, but your neighbours and the community in general.

### RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commences on **19 SEPTEMBER 2014** and continues until **15 APRIL 2015** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2014** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2015** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2014.





# Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

**Thornely, David** – Came to Sunnyside on 9<sup>th</sup> January 1889 to take over Gypsy Jack's flock at the Gordon. Two days later he left with TN to take Climie's sheep to Pootenup, staying overnight at Killibinup. They reached Jack Wells' at the Gordon on 13<sup>th</sup> and, at Pootenup on the 15<sup>th</sup> the sheep from Bones' flock was added to Thornley's – totaling 1115. TN drafted off 21 for the railway navies if required.

**Timber -** In his diary WHG refers to using she-oak for slabs and shingles; mahogany for slabs for the wall; white gum for cart stuff; yat for cart shafts. On 18<sup>th</sup> December 1863 he wrote "The peach tree (quongdong) turned out some most beautiful boards." Jam (Strawberry Jam Wattle) was used from earliest days until fairly recently for very efficient fence posts, many still standing.

**Tom** – Unidentified. In November 1864, Tom was working in the garden at Fairfield and haymaking. On 8<sup>th</sup> he was sent to Jim Watson with rations and to be his hutkeeper. The next day he brought Charlie's things in. On 26<sup>th</sup> January 1865, Maher told WHG that Tom was lost in the bush and when Jim Watson went out to his flock, WHG sent two natives with him to look for Tom. On 27<sup>th</sup> Whitehead came from Ewleymartup and said Tom had not been found, but two days later Constable Preston arrived with Tom who had found his way to Haddleton's. WHG settled with him and he left for Albany with P.C. Preston.

**Toovey, Henry** – On 7<sup>th</sup> December 1880, TN sent him 11 culls and in May 1886 TN referred to a tank between Townsend's and Toovey's – that is near Pootenup. In March 1888, Toovey was granted a contract to supply forage to the railway men and TN sent Charlie Ward to do the carting. In May Harry came to Sunnyside for chaff and returned in October to cart TN's sheepskins for Climie – 670lbs at 2½. Per lb – together with some of Lady Campbell's.

Townsend, Henry James - "Silver Grass" - property near Pootenup, below Pingelup. TN regularly called on Henry Townsend whenever he was in the area visiting his shepherds or on route to or from Albany, and was minding some of Townsend's sheep. In March 1886 Townsend bought 20 bushels of wheat £7, 4 bushels barley £1. On 28th July Townsend was witness in the Court case at Kojonup against Baggs, Kain and Finefellow for being drunk and neglecting TN's sheep. On 30th September, Paddy and Finefellow were sent to bring Townsend's sheep up for shearing. On 6th November 1886 Henry called on TN at Sunnyside to see about his sheep and two days later they both went to Balgarup to see if Joseph spencer would take the flock, but Joseph had rheumatism so TN agreed to keep his sheep for another year at £6 per hundred and to attend to one shepherd. A. Moir was given the flock and started for Townsend's with 955 wethers. However when Townsend visited Sunnyside for several days in November 1888, TN apparently had the sheep still as he made the flock up to 991 and in January 1889 paid £40 sheep rent. Mrs Townsend visited Goblup in January 1893 and TN drove her over to Broome Hill to go home on 2<sup>nd</sup> February.

**Travelling Agents** – On 16<sup>th</sup> June 1892 TN and Mrs Norrish went into Broome Hill to Carmody's where they bought £10.3.6 worth of clothing from Woolf & Co representative. In February 1893 and agent for Singer Sewing Machines called at Goblup and three days later brought back a machine for the ladies to try. The machine was kept and TN paid £11.5.0. In March that year Sanderson's man called to see if TN wanted any machinery. TN ordered a hand sowing machine so that his son Richard could sow wheat at Sunnyside.


