Thanks go to outgoing Fire Control Officers Nathan Heron, Jerome Hardie and John Cristinelli for their efforts while in their respective roles. It is great to see brigade members prepared to step up and take on key roles within the brigades, so it is not left to the same people each time. It is also pleasing to note all Fire Control Officers have completed the training required to undertake the role. Council understands training is an imposition on everyone's time, however it may be that something you learn from that course makes the difference in a critical situation.

Council received the notes from the meetings of the Tambellup Sports Pavilion Advisory Committee held in March and April. This included consideration of the concept plan feedback from clubs. Council determined to invite the architect to the Council meeting in June to discuss the plans further.

Council conducted a review of its Ten Year Plant Replacement Program. The plan has been developed to give Council an overview of the future plant requirements of the organisation and also includes estimates for future replacement costs. Costings relating to the changeover of a grader, the light fleet and other items of small plant will be considered by Council as part of the annual budget deliberations.

COUNCIL WORKS

Works have been carried out to enlarge the Broomehill Town Dam, to extend the capacity from 7,500 cubic metres to 13,500 cubic metres. This work was completed just in time to catch some of the first significant rains for the season during May. More work will be undertaken in the near future to erect fencing and clean up around the dam to ensure the maximum amount of water is directed into this dam. Upcoming works will see a pump and pipework being installed at the CBH retention pond on Nardlah Rd to transfer water to the Complex Dam.

At the Tambellup Sports Ground, contractors have completed the construction of three new 150Kl concrete tanks. These tanks will enable treated waste water from the Water Corporation Treatment Plant to be used to reticulate the oval, as well as storing water from the No. 1 Dam on Jam Creek Rd for use on the oval and townsite parks and gardens. The infrastructure required to transfer the water to where it is required is being installed at present. These projects have been made possible through Royalties for Regions funding received by the Southern Link Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils, of which the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is a member council.

The construction crew has been gravel sheeting on South Pallinup Rd, with vegetation widening in this area to be completed in coming months. The crew has now moved to Warrenup Rd to complete gravel sheeting.

Surveyors have been engaged to set out the works to stagger the northern approach to the Beejenup Rd/Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd crossroads.

Repairs to bitumen blowouts have been carried out by bitumen contractors on Pootenup Rd, Tambellup West Rd, Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd and Broomehill-Kojonup Rd. Council's Jetpatcher is also working on bitumen roads in the Shire. The maintenance graders have been working across the middle of the Shire.

WASTE TRANSFER STATIONS

Council wishes to advise it is proposed that Waste Transfer Stations will be operational from 3 July 2014. Council has accepted a quote from Warren Blackwood Waste to staff and fully manage the facilities. Opening hours for both sites are as follows:

The Waste Transfer Stations, which will be manned, will accept domestic waste, and a variety of recyclable material. All recycling is free, however materials for recycling must be clean, sorted and uncontaminated by non recyclable material. Waste that would normally go direct to landfill will attract a fee. The fees and charges relating to the use of the Waste Transfer Stations are included in this edition of BT Times, and these, with more information about the Waste Transfer Stations, will be available on Council's website – www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/waste.

Prior to the opening of the facilities, we will be mailing out Annual Tip Passes to all rural property owners and those who do not receive a weekly rubbish collection service. Annual Tip Passes contain 52 tokens, each with a monetary value of \$2.80. Each token entitles household rubbish equivalent to one standard 240 litre wheelie bin to be deposited at either Waste Transfer Station. If you attend the facility with a larger quantity of rubbish, the attendant will advise how many tokens will be required.

Property owners with more than one occupied residence on their land will be able to make application for additional Annual Tip Passes.

Pre-Paid Tip Passes will also be available, for rural residents wishing to dispose of more rubbish than the Annual Tip Pass will allow, and for residents who receive a weekly rubbish collection service. The Pre-Paid Tip Passes will be available with 5 tokens (cost is \$14.00 inc GST), 10 tokens (\$28.00 inc GST) or 20 tokens (\$56.00 inc GST).

Pre-Paid Tip Passes should be purchased at either Shire office PRIOR to attending at the Waste Transfer Stations, as no cash is handled on site. Unused tokens on Tip Passes are not refundable for cash.

People wishing to dispose of bulk quantities of rubbish (ie bulk bin or truckload) are asked to contact the Shire during office hours to make an appointment to do so. All fees must be paid prior to attendance at the Waste transfer Station.

The purpose of a Waste Transfer Station is to minimise the amount of waste going to landfill, and maximise opportunities for recycling. By sorting your load before you go to the Tip, and making sure your recyclables are clean and uncontaminated, you will be doing your bit to help our environment.

TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENT LIVING SENIORS ACCOMMODATION

As the works on the units site continues, the paper trail has been finalised, with Council endorsing all the documents required for the management of the units, and for intending residents. It is anticipated the units will be ready for occupation by the end of the year. All pensioners are reminded that in order to claim the Pensioner Rebate in 2014 the amount due on your rate notice needs to be paid (in full) before 30 June, 2014. If you think you may be eligible for a rebate and require further information, please contact Kay O'Neill at the Shire. If you haven't registered as a pensioner please do so as soon as possible. We will require a copy of your pension card.

MICROCHIP YOUR PET

17 JUNE 2014



With the introduction of the Cat Act 2011 and changes to the Dog Act 1976, it is now a legal requirement to have your dog and cat microchipped. It is also a requirement of both these Acts that, if your furry friend is impounded and not microchipped, the animal must be microchipped before it can be released from the pound.

As residents of Broomehill and Tambellup do not have easy access to a Veterinary service, Council has trained up a staff member to be able to implant a microchip in impounded animals. In order for the training to be complete, the staff member is required to chip a number of animals under the strict supervision of a qualified veterinarian.

In order to facilitate this last part of the training, Council has been working with the Mt Barker Vet and has organised a session on 17 June 2014 in Tambellup, to chip a limited number of dogs and cats.

This is an excellent opportunity to get your pets micro chipped close to home. The Council has agreed to subsidise the cost and make the service available at \$50 per animal.

If you wish to take up this limited, once off offer, please contact **Marni** at the Shire Office on **9825 3555** to book a place. There are only 30 places available – 15 cats and 15 dogs – so get in early. Bookings need to be made by **Friday 13 June 2014**. Vaccination is also available on the day if required, so please let Marni know if you wish to utilise this additional service.

In taking up this offer you will need to

- Ring Marni at the Shire office on 9825 3555 to book your cat and/or dog in
- Pay the fee of \$50 per animal at the Shire office before Friday, 13 June 2014
- Your pet must be registered
- All dogs and cats need to be clean and free of skin conditions

For the 2014 race season CDMC are holding a monthly Club Day, however the Rockwell Flats track is open for practice on Saturday, Sunday (and Wednesday for junior's 4-16years only). This is to encourage local motocross enthusiasts to ride at a safe, Motorcycling WA approved venue.

- 1) To gain access to the track for practice the following is required:
Motorcycling WA annual licence (rider accident insurance). There are two rates, being competitive or non-competitive costing \$100.
- 2) CDMC annual membership, \$130 senior (16 plus years) and \$90 junior
- 3) A friend willing to be a rider supervisor of up to 5 motocross riders. This person must have St John Ambulance first aid accreditation and have completed the Motorcycling WA online level one course.
- 4) Notify CDMC club secretary once you have met the above criteria to apply for a key to the gate. See our website www.cranbrookmx.com

Local War Histories

Our local Shire libraries now have copies of professionally researched local war histories available for public viewing.

In 2013 Council engaged Ms Sandra Playle, Vision Research Services, to research and compile paper based copies and an electronic database of local war histories; specifically, of war service men and women who were either born in, or enlisted from, Broomehill or Tambellup. Ms Playle travelled to Tambellup and presented the histories to Council preceding its February 2014 Ordinary Meeting.

The compilation, available for perusal at our Shire libraries, consists of six, spiral bound volumes of history relating to World War 1 defence personnel; six, spiral bound volumes relating to World War 2, Korea and Vietnam defence personnel; and copies of Commonwealth War Graves Commission certificates for each of those who died as a direct result of war service. The World War 1 histories are more comprehensive due to privacy regulations still applying to the other Wars.

On the Shire's website you will find a list of the war service men and women for whom there are war histories available; alternatively, please call into, or contact, either of our Shire libraries (located in the Broomehill Administration office on the Great Southern Highway, Broomehill [98 253555] or the Community Resource Centre, Norrish Street, Tambellup [98 251177]) for further information. The histories are for personal use only and may not be copied or published without the prior consent of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup.

Tambellup World War 1 Honour Board and War Memorial

In 2013 Council successfully applied for and received grant funding to restore the badly warped Tambellup World War 1 Honour Board; the Board, restored by Ray Ford Signs of Katanning, can once again be viewed on the northern facing interior wall of the Tambellup Town Hall.

If you happen to be going past the war memorial in Norrish Street, Tambellup, you may notice that this cenotaph has also had a facelift; the structure has been professionally cleaned and re-pointed and the World War 2 names re-painted.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Symers, Stewart – Friend of W.H. Graham and the Taylor brothers of Albany. Came to Nanamillup with Camby Taylor on the 15th December 1864 on a visit. Johnnie Taylor was already there. As with all visitors in those times, Stewart took part in all the activities around the place. He helped with battening and went kangarooing. They all went out to Ewlymartup, Nabrungup and for a bathe at Nimerup. From 21st December they spent 5 days horse hunting at Noring Quiryarup, Wagercarrup and Yangup where Stewart stayed for a couple of days. On 3rd January 1865 Stewart went out shepherding and the next day he and Camby Taylor started for Albany, going as far as Solomon Drolf's with W.H.G.

Tassell, H & R. H. – Tassells arrived on 12th August 1895 to paper some of the rooms at Goblup and started work next day. H Tassell left for Albany on 20th August and 4 days later Richard Norrish took Tassell's things to Broome Hill. TN charged him £2.1.0 for two weeks and four days board counted as one man. On 6th September 1895 he sent R.H. Tassell a cheque for £2.10.11.

Taylor, John and Campbell - Sons of Patrick Taylor and Mary (nee Bussell) of Candyup, Albany. They were two and four years younger than WHG and close friends. From late 1863 and through 1864 Johnnie was frequently at Nanmillup and also seems to have spent time at Eticup (Edward Spencer's). WHG refers to his being "out" but doesn't say from where. It is unlikely that he would have made so many trips "out" from Albany although it could have been from Joseph Spencer's at Balgarup. At various times he came out for sugar, tobacco, flour and spikes and he also borrowed an adze. He accompanied WHG (and others) firefighting at Mungeratup, separating ewes at Tambilyillup, visiting shepherd at Ewlymartup, Nabrungup and bathing at Nimerup, collecting thatch at Wacungup and horsehunting at Noring, Quiryarup, Wagercarrup and Yaungup. On 28th September 1864 they helped Edward Spencer finish his shearing at Eticup. When they went with WHG to Yaungup on 17th July that year, "they dropped in for a bit of graft"!

Taylor, N – Land Agent at Broome Hill. On 7th September 1907, TN's sons, Richard and Will, went to Broome Hill to a farewell social for N Taylor.

Taylor – A shoemaker referred to by TN in 1879 and 1880 only. He worked at Goblup from 14th June to 5th July 1879 when TN settled with him for the work he had done for the men. He was at Goblup seven times during January, February, March and April 1880 but TN does not indicate whether he did any work. On the last call he was accompanied by a man named McGuiness. On 12th May 1880 a Mrs Taylor and another woman called at Goblup.

Helen Kowald brought along some beautiful hollyhock flowers, she made it a bit of a fun quiz asking ladies to guess what they were and who grew them, only two ladies guessed correctly. The flowers were stunning with guessing being camellias or peony roses.

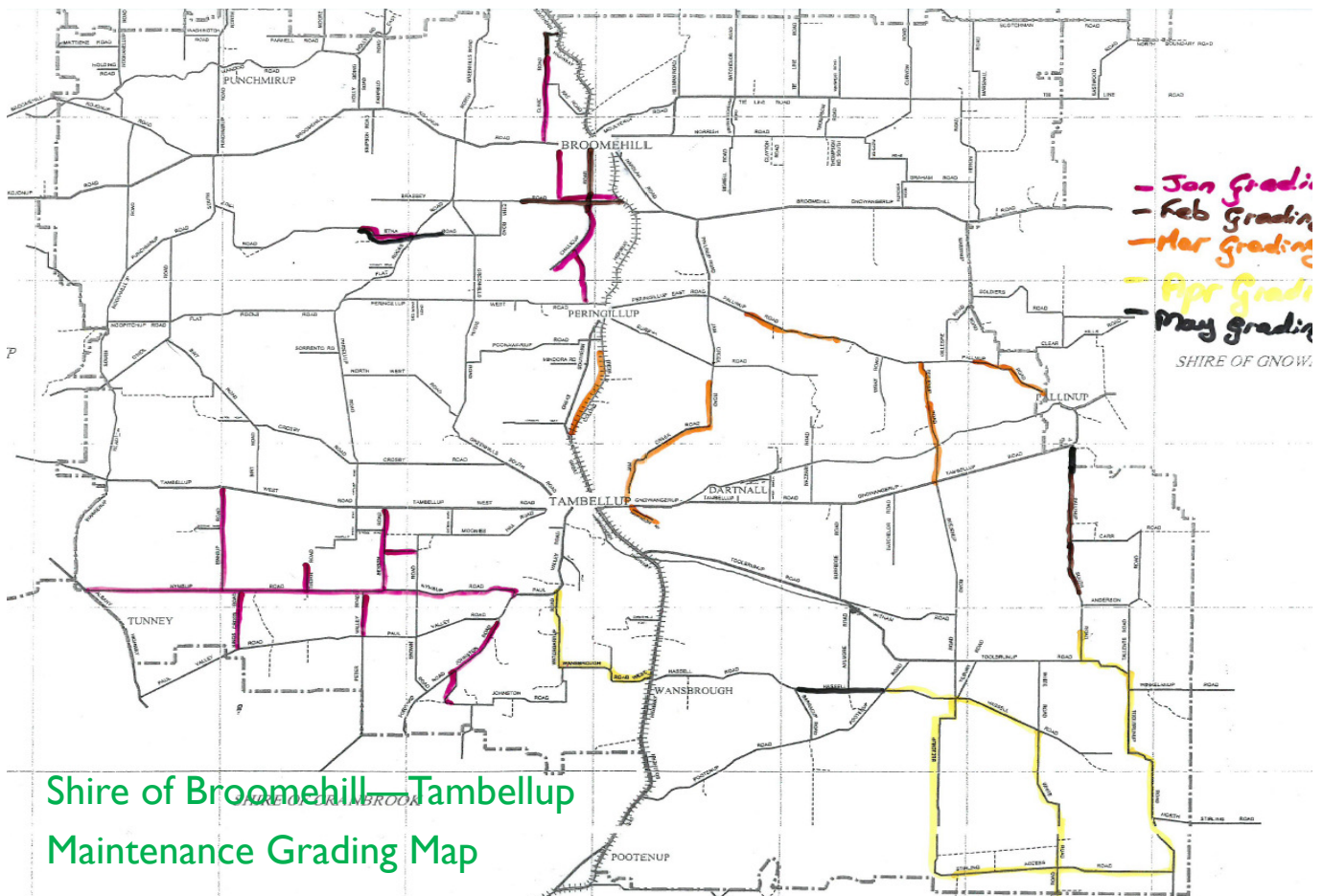
