

FROM THE MARCH COUNCIL MEETING

- Council adopted a revised version of the Strategic Community Plan. The amendment to the Plan included the development of Key Performance Measures to measure the progress towards achievement of each commitment contained within the Plan.
- Council agreed to make a contribution of \$1000 to the Tambellup Primary School to assist with the costs of transporting students to swimming lessons in Gnowangerup. Council makes a similar contribution to the Broomehill Primary School each year.
- Council considered the introduction of the Department of Fire and Emergency Service's program of vehicle identifier stickers for issue to fire brigade volunteers, and has deferred a decision pending feedback from the Bush Fire Advisory Committee.
- Council has indicated it's in principle support to the Water Corporation for the handover of the No. 1 Dam on Jam Creek Rd to the Shire. The dam is surplus to the Water Corporations requirements.

COUNCIL WORKS

During March, resealing was completed on Broomehill Kojonup Rd, Fairfield Rd and Tambellup West Rd. Stabilising of the next section of Tambellup West Rd has also been completed, prior to sealing of this section. All graders have been onsite which has slowed the maintenance grading program temporarily, however now these works are finalised this will recommence. Upcoming construction works include the Blackspot funded works to stagger the intersection of Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd and Beejenup Rd, and the construction of a taper to allow roadtrains to turn safely left from Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd onto Great Southern Highway. Motorists are asked to take care when travelling in the vicinity of road works and observe all warning signage in place.

Running alongside the construction projects, Council's Jetpatcher truck is working around the shire patching bitumen roads.

Work on the transfer stations is progressing, with the fencing to be completed in Broomehill, and also kerbing and the construction of an office at each site. Works have commenced at the Tambellup Sports Ground to lay pads for the construction of the new concrete water tanks, and piping to the Waste Water Treatment Plant on Cremasco Rd. These activities form part of the Stormwater Harvesting and Waste Water Reuse projects, funded by the Country Local Government Fund Regional Allocation. During the construction, access to the Sports Ground is only available from the East Terrace entrance.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

Council's Club Development Officer, Amelia Simpson, resigned from her position early in March. With the funding for this existing position ending on 30 June 2014, Council, together with the Shire of Kojonup, submitted an application to the Department of Sport and Recreation for the next round of Club Development Officer funding. Advice has recently been received that the application was unsuccessful, and Council will now need to consider which way it wishes to proceed in relation to club development.

In the meantime, the Kidsport program will still be administered by the Shire. Enquiries in this regard from clubs or club members can be directed to Pam Hull on 9825 3555. Further information about the future direction of club development in Broomehill-Tambellup will be made available at a later date.

We take the opportunity to thank Amelia for her efforts whilst in the role, and wish her well for her future endeavours.

TAMBELLUP INDEPENDENT LIVING SENIORS ACCOMMODATION

The project continues to move along nicely. All the units bar one have colourbond roofing completed, and cladding of the outside walls has commenced giving the complex a 'nearly there' look (although we know there is still a lot of work to be done). Windows have been installed and the connection of each unit to utilities is underway.

The Independent Living Seniors Accommodation committee met recently to consider the next stage of the administration process, the Tenant's Handbook. This booklet provides tenants with information which they may find useful during their tenancy.

As previously advised, we will be making contact with those people who have registered their interest in renting a unit, once all the documentation has been finalised by the committee and Council.





We also invite others in the community who may be interested to contact Pam at the Shire on 9825 3555. The main criteria is that you must be over the age of 55 years to be eligible.

VANDALISM

It is disappointing to note the increase in vandalism which has been occurring in Tambellup over the last few weeks. This has included broken windows at the Youth Centre, Shire Office and Tambellup Sports Pavilion, an instance of someone cleaning fish and leaving the fish guts in the handbasin of the disabled toilets, and another of faeces smeared over walls, the floor, and fixtures at the Diprose Park toilets. The cost to rectify the matters above, through replacement of windows and cleaning of toilets, was in the vicinity of \$4000, and this cost is passed on to the community through rates, fees and charges. Are you happy for your rates to be spent in this way when they could contribute to something positive for our community?

Aside from the broken windows, the public toilets are used by many visitors passing through town. A visitor confronted by the mess that our cleaning staff have had to deal with, is not going to leave with a positive impression of our town, and word spreads! We urge all residents to be vigilant, and contact the Police on 131 444 if any suspicious or antisocial activity is observed. Calls to this number are automatically diverted to the nearest police station, and if local staff are not rostered on, it may go through to Albany Police.

The community also urges parents to uphold their responsibility to know where their kids are, who they are with and what they are doing!

All residents are advised the **RESTRICTED** burning period has been <u>extended to Tuesday 22nd April</u> <u>inclusive</u>. You will require a permit to light any fires prior to this date.






The Broomehill Primary School's Parents and Citizens Association wishes to thank the seven families who donated grain to our organization during the 2013-14 harvest.




Broomehill-Tambellup Junior Cricket boys at the last game of the season,

Expressions of Interest

Department of Agriculture and Food (WA) is involved in a GRDC funded project called EverCrop which used to be part of the FFI CRC (the CRC finishes on the 30 June 2014). The project has been working in the Northern Agricultural Region on pasture cropping i.e. cropping into existing stands of perennials. In the next phase of EverCrop we would like to extend the pasture cropping approach to more southern cropping regions with possible new species mixes (we were working with Rhodes grass and Panic grass in the north). This will include on-farm demonstrations involving pasture cropping with different perennials such as kikuyu and lucerne in partnership with local farmer groups. We were wondering if Gillamii Centre would be interested in hosting one of the demonstrations and if there is interest by the farmers. We would like to run a discussion group around this topic to extend knowledge as well as obtain feedback on the technology. In addition, we would like it to be part of a spring field day tour. In terms of the demonstration we will provide the following:

- Trial design with input from the farmer
- Some operating to supply seed/fertiliser/chemical
- We will supply man power for trial pegging/monitoring/sample processing
- We will supply (if it can be negotiated) a plot harvester to obtain grain yields

From the farmer we require:

- Interest, energy, labour and seeding& spraying equipment to implement the demonstration
- Be part of the discussion group
- Allow access for a field day

Farmers - used oil can be collected! Contact the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup

Australian farmers are well recognised as environmental stewards, owning, managing and caring for 61% of our countries land mass.

Wren Oil has been delivering waste oil re-refining and hydrocarbon waste management disposal solutions to agriculture, industry, mining and local communities for over 30 years.

A recent survey has identified there are in excess of 12,000 farms in WA

It is estimated from the above statistics that some 5 million litres of waste oil is produced by farms annually. The contaminants in this waste oil include- lead, cadmium, chromium, arsenic, dioxins, benzene and polycyclic aromatics.

The real risk for farmers is contamination of the ground water supply by the incorrect or long term storage of waste oil on rural properties. Leaking containers and incorrectly disposed used oil can cause severe damage to valuable water supplies in rural areas.

Wren Oil can provide farmers with suitable collection pods, assisting farmers to meet their own environmental obligations. The amount of oil currently being collected from rural areas is not reflective of the amount sold into these areas by oil companies and the service industry.

Wren Oil is prepared to work with Farmers and Local Government and other sections of the local communities to develop a sound and ongoing method to deal with this issue.

The collection of used oil, which is a simple logistic issue in our cities, is more difficult for our regional centres and communities. You can play your part by enquiring with your local government authority about how you can dispose of your used oil correctly.

The more oil collected from one site lowers the cost of collection and so a co-ordinated program involving farmers, Local Government and Wren Oil could have great financial benefits to all involved as well as improving environmental outcomes.

Under the "Product Stewardship for Oil Program", the Australian Government provides industry incentives to increase the recycling of used motor oil. More information relating to this program can be found at www.oilrecycling.gov.au/what-happens

Wren Oil is proposing to commence a 'Farm Oil Pickup Service' in Broomehill-Tambellup and surrounding areas. This is a free service to farmers.

To register for an oil pickup, farmers are invited to contact Marni at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup on 9825 3555 with details of your oil pickup, including quantity of oil and contact phone number.

At the end of each month, this information will be passed on to Wren Oil, who will contact you directly to arrange a collection time.

A minimum quantity of 1000lt of oil at a single collection point is required. Why not chat to your neighbours and coordinate a neighbourhood pickup???

Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Sunnyside - TN's second homestead which he named Sunnyside (the first was Ettakup) is situated on Kojonup Location 206 on Ettakup Road which is now KojonupRaod. The 100 acre (40.5 ha) block was first allocated to Joseph Kennedy as Immigrant Grant 21 but apparently Kennedy failed to carry out any improvements and on 15th May 1883 TN wrote in his diary Went to Mr Van Zuilecom this evening to get from him a certificate stating that there are no improvements on the 100 acres that did belong to Kennedy." TN must have been confident of gaining the land, as on 19th January 1883, he drove with his wife and family in the carriage from Goblup over to the place where he intended to build his house, and on 15thFebraury 1883 he received a letter from Green & Thomas, Builders of Albany, agreeing to build the house for £597 but no flooring on the verandah or paint on the ceilings. The first of the builders arrived on 24th June – William Thomas, William Wray and Edwin Palmer to board at Goblup and George Thomas to board with his father-in-law, Joseph Nelson. On 24th August the second team arrived – John Green and his two sons, and carpenters Costello and Sherwood. The bricks for the building were made near the site probably sometime earlier as William Barrett had been hired in 1881 to make 40 000 bricks at £1 per thousand. Sand and stones were carted in by TN's men and timber, verandah posts, door frames and other material were carted up from Albany by neighbours and others - Elijah ford, James Annice, Thomas Schilling, William Peate, John Grover, Joseph Nelson and Patrick Carmody. John Grover also brought up 1 ton of zinc, Carmody carted about 80 sheets of iron, and Alfred Nelson brought ceiling boards.

On 17th November 1883, the Governess (Hannah Williams), the maid (Emma Knapp) and six of the seven children moved into Sunnyside. On 11th December, TN, Mrs Norrish and Toddler William also moved over from Goblup.

All walls of the house were double brick in the English bond style, ie; without a cavity. There are no ventilators in the walls but the fire places in every room (8 in all) provide good airflow. Even when the chimneys of all unused fireplaces were covered in the 1980s, it was found that air still entered the rooms through the gaps in the floorboards. In fact, during restoration work in 1982, the occupiers of the house were told not to lay wall-to-wall floor covering as that would restrict ventilation.

The men's rooms and forge – the small building closer to the road- were erected about 1885 by Benjamin Gaylor who had been hired by TN to make bricks for the Eticup Church. It is assumed that bricks left over from the church were used together with the bricks from the kiln that had been built to burn lime. These are thought to be the very dark bricks that create the checkered effect on the west and south walls; this pattern is believed to be Flemish bond.

When TN and his family moved back to Goblup in 1890 for him to take on the responsibility of running the station for Lord Brassey, Mrs Norrish's brother, William Plumpton Wray, leased Sunnyside for about two years from July. During this period, William Wray, with the help of TN's son George, fenced the Sunnyside property.

On TN's death in 1908, the eldest surviving son, Richard, inherited the bulk of the property, a portion in the Ettakup Pool area going to William who later sold this parcel to Tom Richardson. About 1927, Richard also sold the main property to Tom Richardson. A manager lived in the homestead for a period, but as far as is known, no member of the Richardson family took up residence. About 1936, Alfred Nelson's son William of Peerenellup purchased Sunnyside. The property was finally sold to Ross. D. Meyer. Late in 1979, TN's descendants arranged with Ross Meyer to take over the homestead and restore it.

During 1980, several of TN's descendants worked on the house on weekends, got three rooms fit for habitation and on 6th June 1981, a granddaughter moved in. Various external additions that were constructed in the 1940s and 50s were removed and the house now looks much the same as it did in 1883.






