Works

The parks and gardens crew have taken advantage of recent rains, planting street trees and garden plants in both Broomehill and Tambellup. At the same time, a number of trees have been trimmed in response to direction from Western Power. Work has commenced on the oval fertilising program which will be ongoing for twelve months. Works will include vertimowing and aerating in the spring, to encourage strong healthy growth.

The construction crew has been working on the northern end of Warrenup Rd, where around 10km of gravel resheeting is to be completed. These works are funded through Roads to Recovery and Commodity Routes. Clearing works are underway on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd, towards the Gnowangerup boundary, where a 2.7km section will be widened and sealed.

Council's Jetpatcher truck is home for a spell, and staff will be undertaking bitumen repairs on the Shire's road network. The maintenance crew are working on drainage in both townsites, and the maintenance graders have been working in the mid-western part of the Shire.

Tambellup Independent Living Seniors Accommodation

Finally! We are pleased to report that the tender for the construction of the Seniors Units has been advertised. Tenders close on 7th August, and Council will consider all submissions, and award the tender at the August Council meeting. This is a major milestone of the project, and we hope to see action on site in the near future. For anyone interested, copies of the plans for the units are on display in the foyer of the Tambellup Administration office.

Council Elections

Council elections will be held in October this year, with four positions on Council becoming vacant. If you have ever considered serving your community through this avenue, and would like to find out more about the role, you are encouraged to contact any of the serving Councillors, or alternatively, the Chief Executive Officer, who can provide more information.

Tambellup Cemetery

Those visiting the cemetery recently will have noticed the new gazebo which has been erected inside the main gates. The gazebo will house the new niche wall which local contractor Paul Plant is constructing. People with ashes of family members interred in the existing wall will be contacted in due course with regard to transferring ashes to the new wall. Similarly, people with reserved niches will be contacted to transfer their reservation to the new wall. The current works will not impact on the existing wall in any way.

Tambellup Sports Pavilion Upgrade

At the July Council meeting, Council accepted the Feasibility Study for the Tambellup Sports Pavilion Upgrade, prepared by Keston Technologies. The report was comprehensive in its consultation with the community and based on the recommendations made, Council has determined that its preference at this time is to proceed with a new build of the facility which will incorporate a bowling green, rather than a refurbishment of the existing building. Concept plans have been developed and community feedback will be sought on the plans.

The next step is to establish a Steering Committee for the project. It is proposed the Committee, comprised of Councillors and community members, will drive the project through the construction phase, but also consider various options of the ongoing management of the new facility. Clubs and groups will shortly been invited to nominate a representative to the committee.

Alongside the formation of the Steering Committee, Council has commenced the preparation of funding applications, to the Regional Development Australia Fund, and the Department of Sport and Recreation's Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund. Both applications are crucial to the success of the project and we are hopeful of a positive outcome. The upgrade will be a long term project, however Council is confident that with the support of the community the outcome will be facilities that generations of residents can be proud of.

Fire Control Officer Training

Have you been elected to the position of Fire Control Officer for your brigade? Or are you in line to take over in coming years as part of the brigade succession plan?

Vandalism

In response to the ongoing vandalism that is occurring at various public locations in both towns, Council has purchased and installed security cameras which provide time lapse photos capable of identifying those responsible. The cameras have been installed at sites where vandalism has been experienced recently and staff will monitor the images provided. It should also be noted the cameras will be moved around both towns as required, and images will be provided to police if necessary to resolve issues.

2013-2014 BUDGET OVERVIEW

The 2013-2014 Budget was adopted by Council at the Ordinary Council meeting in July. The 2013-2014 Budget includes an increase in Rural UV rates of 5% and townsite GRV rates of 5%, with minimum rates increasing to \$375.00 per assessment. Highlights of the budget include:

ROADS

The 2013/2014 budget includes a large capital road works program with \$2,266,500 of expenditure allocated to various roads. Council will be assisted in meeting the costs of the projects with funds from the Regional Road Group, State Black Spot, Commodity Routes and Roads to Recovery programs.

ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS – COUNTRY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND

Council will receive its 2012/13 allocation from the Country Local Government Fund of \$374,900 during 2013/2014. These funds have been allocated to —

Independent Living Seniors Accommodation

\$324,900 will be allocated to this project. The total project cost is \$1,590,000 with the balance of funds coming from the Royalties for Regions Action Agenda funding, Bendigo Bank, Tambellup Senior Citizens Unit Management Committee and Reserves.

Solar Energy - Broomehill Administration Building

\$50,000 is to be spent installing solar panels and equipment to provide renewable energy to the Broomehill Administration Building. This will be done in conjunction with the Archive Repository project.

Allocations received in previous financial years have not yet been fully expended and the balance of funds has been carried forward into the 2013/2014 budget. The funds are held for the following projects –

Tambellup Sports Pavilion Refurbishment – carry over 2011/12

\$200,000 has been allocated to the refurbishment of the Tambellup Sports Pavilion. Works will include the new fit out of the kitchen, full painting internal and external, heating and refurbishment of the toilets.

Window Replacement – Broomehill Administration Building - carry over 2010/11

The existing windows in the Broomehill Library and across the rear of the Administration Building are in urgent need of replacement. Initial estimates put the replacement cost at \$50,000. This project will be done in conjunction with the Archive Repository Project.

Country Local Government Fund – Regional component

The 2010/2011 financial year saw 35% of the 2009-2010 CLGF allocation administered via a regional pool, while the 2011/2012 provided 50% of the funds administered via the regional pool.

Broomehill-Tambellup has identified its regional grouping as the Southern Link VROC which includes the Shires of Cranbrook, Kojonup and Plantagenet. The funding is to be pooled for the group as a whole. The intention of the regional groupings component is to provide financial assistance to local governments so fund larger scale infrastructure projects which demonstrate wider community benefits across a region. Business cases have been developed and approved for the following programs.

OTHER PROJECTS

Integrated Planning

Regulations were amended to accommodate the introduction of Integrated Planning for Local Governments in WA, which came into effect on 01 July 2013. The new planning processes will provide the basis for improving the practice of strategic planning in local government and attain a greater level of community participation.

At the June 2013 ordinary meeting Council adopted the Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan, along with the informing documents being the Asset Management Plan, Long Term Financial Plan and Workforce Plan. The 2013/2014 budget has provided for the implementation and continuing development of these plans.

PLANT REPLACEMENT

Council continues to strive to maintain a modern fleet of vehicles and equipment. To assist with this Council has developed a Ten Year Plant Replacement program that identifies optimum changeover times and includes a financial plan designed to minimise the impact on annual budgets. The 2013/2014 budget proposes to upgrade/purchase the following equipment during the year:

CONCLUSION

The 2013/2014 budget provides for the operations of the Council for the coming financial year. The total budget for the year is approximately \$13.9m of which \$7.3m (52.5%) will be spent on capital projects. At a glance the funds will be spent in the following areas

Council continues to strive for the ongoing improvement and upgrade of its assets. The area of Transport including capital road works and plant replacement, accounts for just over 48% of the overall budget with the other large areas of expenditure being Education and Welfare at 11%, Recreation and Culture 10% and Governance sitting at 7%.

Various funding programs for road construction, as well as community projects, have contributed considerably to this year's bigger budget. This budget is the largest that Council has adopted since amalgamation. The challenge now lies ahead to ensure that the services and projects are delivered in a cost effective, timely manner.






The Tambellup Lions Club commenced their 36th year of serving the local community with their changeover night on Wednesday 10th July at the Tambellup Hotel.



Our members are our most enduring assets and have evolved with us as we collaborate, network and create wider opportunities for rural, regional and remote Australia."





Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Smith, John – This man is thought to have been Black Jack Smith whom Sarah Norrish talked about in later years and is assumed to be the same Jack Smith who worked for TN, on and off, as a general servant from the 1870s until about 1890 and then again from 1898 for an unknown period. Until June 1883 he was employed on various jobs including taking rations and water to shepherd's, carting sandalwood from the north-east and timber from the saw pits at Wadgegannup, helping to shift flocks to other locations and build building shepherd huts and lambing yards. On 31st January 1892 it was Jack Smith, carting timber with George Fox, who met TN at Kelly's camp and told him that Mrs Norrish had had a son on 20t8th January. And it was Jack Smith who was sent to meet TN on his way home from Warkalup and 3rd March 1882 and tell him that the child was not expected to live. A family myth has it that, at Warkalup on 2nd March, TN had dreamt that Jack Smith had come to meet him with a small box under his arm, saying that the child (Arthur Ernest) had died, and that next day reality had repeated the dream except for the small box. However, it is known that the baby did not die until 1 o'clock on 4th M<arch. Many years later, Sarah Norrish in writing about this incident accredited the identity of the messenger to Black Jack Smith in one record and One Arm Jack in another.

Unfortunately this Jack Smith had a drinking problem. On 6th May 1879 at Goblup he got drunk and left but the next day he came back having changed his mind. On 31st March 1881 he was very ill with the cramps and on 25th April told TN that he would drink no more spirits while he was in the country. On 7th September 1882, he went to Kojonup on a spree and came back on the 10th. On 2nd June 1883, he was drunk and on the 25th he was drunk again and had a row so TN let him go. It is possible that he got work at Marleyup as , on 14th June 1883, he brought TN a letter from Richard Norrish and returned to Richard's.

On July 13th 1884, Jack Smith came to Sunnyside wanting to stay and work and he started two days later. Jobs listed were; gong to McGuires to pick up the beef and rice that Tommy McGuire had brought up from Albany for TN, and carting firewood on the sledge. The sledge was also used for carting slabbed timber for the garden fence. There is a break in reference to Jack Smith until January 1887 when TN walked up to Krakouer's Store and then came home with Jack Smith to get Alfred Nelson's wagon. In 1888 he took rations to shepherds, helped bush up paddocks, lambing yards and Sheep Wash yards. He took the trap out to pick up shot kangaroos and went to the gravel pits for potatoes, oats and wool bales. In 1898 he helped with cutting timber, grubbing at various locations, and erecting wire netting around Whitton's 200 acre paddock. However on 9th August 1898 he was worse for drink; William Garrity had sent him a bottle of rum.



WALKING OR EXERCISING YOUR DOG?

Do you know your responsibilities?

The Dog Act 1976 (Act) is administered and enforced by local governments. This Act addresses the control, registration, ownership and keeping of dogs, and the obligations and rights of dog owners and others.

Dog control

If you own a dog, you have a legal responsibility to keep it under control, either within a fenced area on your property or on a leash when in public (you can be given an on-the-spot fine of \$100 for not having your dog on a leash or for allowing it to roam [except at designated dog exercise areas] – if the matter goes to court, the penalty can be up to \$1,000). If your dog excretes on a thoroughfare or other public place, you (the person responsible for control of the dog) must remove the excreta immediately (have a plastic bag with you for this purpose): penalty for not removing excreta, \$200.

Designated dog exercise areas within the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup (for the purposes of sections 31 and 32 of the Act)

Broomehill

- Reserve 634 Javelin Street
- Reserve 1698 Spencer Road
- Lot 24 Broomehill/Kojonup Road

<u>Tambellup</u>

- Reserve 22607 Garrity Street
- Part of Reserve 19757 East Terrace (<u>except for</u> easterly from East Terrace to the eastern boundary of Reserve 19757 and south of Howard Street to the southern boundary of Reserve 19757)

Dogs must <u>not be exercised</u> in areas where: land has been set apart as a children's playground; land is being used for sporting or other activities, as permitted by the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup (Shire), during the times of such use; or car parks.

Places where dogs are <u>prohibited absolutely</u>

- Public buildings (unless permitted by a sign);
- All premises or vehicles classified as food premises or food vehicles (under the Health (Food Hygiene) Regulations 1993);
- Playgroup Centre Lot 4 India/Journal Streets, Broomehill;
- Recreation Complex Reserve 22820, Broomehill;
- · Primary School Reserve 1697, Broomehill; and
- Part of Reserve 19757 East Terrace, Tambellup (easterly from East Terrace to the eastern boundary of Reserve 19757 and south of Howard Street to the southern boundary of Reserve 19757)

If a dog enters or is in a prohibited place (as stated above), every person liable for the control of the dog at that time commits an offence. The penalty, where the dog is a dangerous dog, is \$2,000; otherwise \$1,000.

Dog Attacks

A dog attack includes a dog aggressively rushing at or attempting to attack a person or animal, as well as tearing clothing, biting or causing physical injury. The dog's owner is also liable for any injury or damage resulting from a dog attack. A person who has been attacked may take private legal action for any injury or damage. The owner of a dog who attacks a person or another animal may be held responsible even if they are not present at the time of the attack (exemptions apply where a dog has been provoked). Penalties for dog attacks are up to \$10,000 and/or 12 months' imprisonment for inciting a dog to attack.



Brown addresses the House on Year Seven Transition

Member for the Agricultural Region, Hon Paul Brown MLC recently addressed the Legislative Chamber on the transition of Year Seven into high school.

The transition of year seven into high school is a topical issue for regionals families whom in some cases will need to send their children away to boarding school a year earlier.

Mr Brown said "this is a very emotive issue for parents. I support the transition, fearing that education in WA will become a two tiered system with regional students falling behind their city counterparts if the push to exempt regional students goes ahead."

Mr Brown also highlighted the introduction of the national curriculum as the catalyst for Western Australia to move year seven into high school to ensure that they receive access to the specialist teachers that are required to prepare children for higher learning throughout their high school years and into tertiary education.

Mr Brown also spoke of the large investment that the Nationals WA have made through Royalties for Regions into regional residential colleges throughout the state, providing a very real alternative to parents to board their children in the regions instead of sending them to board in Perth.

"Merredin Residential College is a very good example of this, where not only has the residential college been upgraded considerably, but the two primary schools and the high school have amalgamated to form a K-12 campus. Merredin Residential College is at full capacity and discussions are underway to build additional beds." Mr Brown said.

Royalties for Regions has also funded the Boarding Away from Home Allowance to assist regional families with the cost of boarding.

Mr Brown spoke of all parent's right to choose, that includes the right to apply for case by case exemptions, the right to send their children to schools and boarding in Perth, and their right to send their children to schools and boarding in regional WA.

Mr Brown emphasised the cost effectiveness and high standard of educational and residential facilities in regional WA that are available to parents.






