

DOG OWNERS – REGISTRATIONS ARE NOW DUE

All dog registrations are due for renewal at <u>31st</u>

October each year. If you own a dog then your dog MUST be registered and MUST be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog MUST be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area.

Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be imposed.

Notification will be sent to owners of dogs with registration expiring in 2013. Payment for

re-registration can be made at either the Broomehill or Tambellup office. Please contact Siegrid at the Shire for more information.

CAT ACT 2011

From 1 November 2013, the Cat Act 2011 comes into effect, and will require that all domestic cats over the age of six months are to be microchipped, sterilised and registered with the relevant local government. Cats will be required to wear a collar and registration tag to ensure that owned cats can be easily identified and returned to their owner.

The purpose of the Cat Act 2011 is to encourage responsible pet ownership and reduce the number of unwanted cats in the community, and the number that are euthanised each year.

The State Government has set the following fees in relation to cat registrations:

1 year registration	\$20.00
3 year registration	\$42.50
Lifetime registration	\$100.00
Breeders registration	\$100.00 per cat (male
or female)	

Registrations for cats which are not sterilised or microchipped are not able to be accepted.

Responsible cat ownership checklist

As a responsible pet owner you are encouraged to:

Keep your cat confined to your property, especially at night. Ensure your cat is easily identifiable with a collar and a name tag.

Microchip your cat.

Sterilise your cat.

Register your cat

Vaccinate your cat.



HARVEST BAN ZONES

Following a request from the Broomehill-Tambellup Fire Advisory Committee, Council has established Harvest Ban Zones in the Shire, to allow for occasions where weather conditions requiring a harvest ban may not affect the entire Shire, or where assistance is required for mopping up after a fire. The Shire has been divided into two zones - the Eastern Zone and the Western Zone - with the Great Southern Highway being the dividing line. Notification of bans only affecting part of the shire will be in accordance with our established procedures - that is, broadcast over ABC radio and Radiowest, SMS to registered contacts, and recorded message on the Harvest Ban Hotline (98251042).

All residents please note: If a ban is imposed which only applies to one zone, <u>both townsites are included in</u> <u>the ban.</u>

Any fires resulting from vehicle movement in paddocks, open fires or hot works during periods where a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban is in force, either in a single zone or across the entire Shire, may result in court action and significant fines.



RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2013** and continues until **31 OCTOBER 2013** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2013** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2014** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2013.







Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Smith, Samuel- Known to have worked for WHG as a teamster in 1873 and by May 1879 was employed by TN. His duties during the rest of the year included carting hurdles and rails to various lambing stations; carting timber for Lady Campbell's tank and water to shepherds; going with TN and Joe Louther to Pootenup to mend a tank; taking chaff to Goblup from George Norrish's and carting sheepskins and wool to Albany and taking six rams imported from Adelaide to Goblup.

On 22nd December he went with Connors and Smart to Josiah Norrish's for Christmas but did not get back until 28th although TN expected him earlier. In January, February and March 1880 Sam made several trips to Albany with TN's wool. He also carted sandalwood to the Gordon, did some ploughing in the garden and took wheat to Van Zuilecom's to be cracked. On 29th June 1880 Sam went with TN to chipper's sale in Kojonup and was apparently given leave as he did not return until 6th July. In the next few months he carted firewood for the brick kiln, took rations to Robinson and went looking for the horse Charley- unsuccessfully. On 9th September 1880, Sam Smith and Deveral started for Albany with 2 loads of sheepskins – 1312lbs (595.6 kg). Arrived in Albany on 13^{th} September, drunk. He was too drunk to start out on the 14^{th} and still drunk on 15th so TN took the team himself. Sam got back to Goblup on 21st September having got a ride with Patrick Carmody. In October 1880 Sam was given a flock to shepherd in "the Paddock" and at the end of April was shifted to Pallinup. On 10th November 1881 Sam accompanied TN to Treasure's sale at Martinup but on the return journey with TN's purchases on the 13th, had to leave the wagon at the Two Mile as the horses could not get it out of the creek. Sam took his flock pout again on the 15^t November but they got in the poison and he brought them back again on 2nd December for drafting. Six sheep had died, TN killed one in the yard and over 50 were sick. TN believed that Smith got drunk at Rogers' on grog that John Holland's teamster had brought out from Albany.

In 1882 Sam's wages as a shepherd were £45 per annum with rations and his flock was usually about 850 animals. On 19th November 1882 he said he was not well and on 2 occasions his flock was given over to Croker to mind. However on 21st March 1883 TN wrote "Sam Smith appears to have gone out of his head. He talks all sorts of nonsense and could not be found this morning. He has since been seen by John Garrity going towards the Gordon without a hat. Said he had to meet me there." Two days later, Louther brought Sam in. "He is still very bad. Raves all night ." By mid-May he appears to have recovered as on 16th he helped lay iron troughing and on 19th he was sent to Thomas O'Brien to follow the lambing flock, an arrangement that did not last long as O'Brien could not get on with either Sam or Leeds Bill and did not want them. On 11th June Sam and Leeds Bill complained about O'Brien's handling of the lambs but TN let them go. Sam stayed in the area for a few months, coming to Sunnyside on a few occasions, once with William Peate to help him cut his chaff. Entries resume in 1886 when Finefellow brought 15 sheep from Martinup to Sunnyside on 9th February – one animal representing the 10/- that Sam Smith owed TN, so it is possible he was working for Treasure. Sam came himself twice in November and helped press wool. On 7th February 1888 TN paid John Garrity £7 on Sam's account and on 19th TN visited Sam Smith's camp. So he had obviously been re-employed. On 24th February 1888 the place for Sam's station was burnt out and TN shifted him to the Gordon River minding the sheep while Sam pitched a tent for himself. On 23rd March Sam gave 1 months notice per TN's son George and TN arranged for Peter McEvoy to take the flock until shearing. Ion 22nd April 1888 George and Sam came in, leaving McEvoy with the sheep at Watagarup, and TN settled with Sam for shepherding.

Desperately seeking cockies

Have you seen any black-cockatoos with white tails lately? Maybe you used to see them but they have disappeared recently. If so, BirdLife Australia wants to hear from you.

BirdLife Australia is asking people across the Wheatbelt and Great Southern Regions to be on the lookout for the large, white-tailed black-cockatoos known as Carnaby's Black-Cockatoos between now and Christmas, and report any sightings.

The population of Carnaby's Black-Cockatoos has been shrinking since the 1950s, and BirdLife Australia is keen to hear from anybody who sees the birds so that we can determine how many there are and exactly where they still occur.

Farmers, townies, schoolkids, Landcare and community groups can all take part and play a vital role in helping us to save this iconic species. It's important that local communities get behind the survey — it will make a significant difference to the birds' survival.

Their survival depends on overcoming various different factors — the loss of nesting and feeding habitat, competition for nesting hollows, illegal shooting and poisoning, being hit by cars and trucks, climate change... the list goes on and on, but across the Wheatbelt and Great Southern regions, the loss of feeding habitat near their nesting sites is the greatest risk, at least in the short term.

If you'd like to get involved, or would like more information, contact BirdLife Australia's Matt Fossey on (08) 9287 2204. It is important that any sightings be reported as soon as possible. The easiest way to do this is via the BirdLife Australia website (<u>http://www.birdlife.org.au/projects/</u> <u>carnabys-black-cockatoo-recovery/breeding-range-survey</u>); it takes only a few moments to complete.



Aldridge urges incoming Federal Government to prioritise agriculture

Nationals WA Agricultural Region member Martin Aldridge MLC is calling on the incoming Federal Government to ensure the State's agriculture industry is not snubbed in place of implementing its "stop the boats" policy.

Mr Aldridge said Australia's diplomatic relationship with Indonesia, its closest neighbour and major trading partner, should be a priority for the Liberal-National Government.

"Under the Federal Labor Government's short-sighted policies, including the sudden and disastrous live export ban in June 2011, agriculture in WA has suffered for the last six years," Mr Aldridge said.

"I urge Prime Minister elect Tony Abbott to work collaboratively with Indonesia and reconsider some of his election priorities such as turning back boats to Indonesia and buying unseaworthy Indonesian fishing boats, plans that seem unlikely to succeed."

Mr Aldridge said preventing further deaths at sea and securing Australia's borders should be a federal priority, however, he emphasised that caution and due diligence was necessary to achieving a positive outcome.

"Indonesian sovereignty should be respected and the relationship with our neighbours should be consolidated, not destabilised by implementing policies unsupported by the Indonesian Government," Mr Aldridge said.

Indonesian foreign minister Marty Natelegawa has expressed concern in relation to some of the proposed policy measures before a meeting of his parliament's foreign affairs commission.

Live cattle exports to Indonesia still remain at low levels after the Australian Government's sudden live export ban in 2011, however, there are signs the situation is improving.

Mr Aldridge welcomed a recent announcement by the Indonesian Government that it intends to scrap the rigid quota system in place in an attempt to reduce imported beef prices locally.

"A first priority for the new minister for agriculture, the Hon Barnaby Joyce MP should be to visit Indonesia and start rebuilding our nation's trade relationship and strengthen export markets for our agricultural sector," Mr Aldridge said.

Fact File

- Indonesia is Australia's largest wheat export market importing more than 3.5 million tonnes valued at A\$1.1 billion in 2011.
- In 2012-13, Australia's beef and live cattle export market was worth an estimated A\$5.2 billion.
- In 2010, Australia exported 517,026 live cattle to Indonesia at a value of \$444 million.
 By 2012 this figure decreased by 46% to 278,581 at a value of \$272 million.




